Additional Backup Information						
This action authorizes acceptance of supplemental grant funding from New York University (NYU) as a sub-recipient of a grant from the National Institute for Standards and Technology. The Austin Fire Department will support NYU research on public safety communication technologies by providing personnel from the Robotic Emergency Deployment Team to use Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) to enhance firefighter safety and improve emergency response through the assessment and implementation of amerging technologies like rehetics. This grant funding will						

response through the assessment and implementation of emerging technologies like robotics. This grant funding will reimburse the City for expenses related to travel, personnel salaries and benefits, and the purchase of materials and supplies for the UAVs. The funding is \$30,000 this fiscal year, and is estimated to be \$25,000 for the next fiscal year, and another \$25,000 for the following fiscal year.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, the Austin Fire Department's need for continuing funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
