GOALS FOR TEMPORARY CONCESSIONS

- □ Conduct an analysis and prepare a report on Austin's Temporary Concession Permit process comparison to similar size cities.
- □Increase recreational experiences in the parks system based on national trends.
- Prepare a community engagement process to gather input on desired recreational experiences at selected parks.
- Evaluate existing parks and their infrastructure for additional recreational experiences capacity.

CURRENT ENFORCEMENT CHALLENGES

- Illegal vending occurring throughout the park system.
- □ Difficult to monitor illegal vending due to limited staff resources.
- Staff training is needed on current vending permit requirements

INITIAL FINDINGS

PARD needs to:

- □ Identify type of park to accommodate vending opportunities and type of services appropriate for each available area.
- □ Evaluate the existing park infrastructure to accommodate temporary concessions.
- Review best practices from other cities and determine the best permitting process for Austin.
- Establish a Temporary Concession Program.
- Review the department's fee structure for temporary concessions
- □ Develop a list of approved vendors on PARD property through the RFA process.
