



- Both parties provide member payments





#### FY 2016 CCC Patient Population by Zip Code - Travis County, TX





Encounters—Patient Visits




**Takeaway:** While the patients served increased by 6.5%, emergency department encounters increased by less than 1%

Takeaway: Increasing primary care visits has reduced ED utilization

FY 2017 projection: +7.5%




## Baselines and Measures: MAP

New for 2018: Increasing pharmacy benefits and extending enrollment period




**Takeaway:** Sendero's community-based insurance plans continue to increase health care coverage


## Central Health Funder Role

 \$158.6 million Central Health investment translated to \$537.7 million dollars used for Central Health's mission.




# Major Texas Hospital Districts: FY 2017 Tax Burden Comparisons






# Share of Local Property Taxes

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








# Funding Model—FY 2017 Budget\*
