

### Local Child Poverty Rates are Declining

The percentage of Travis
County children living in
poverty declined in 2015. All
three local jurisdictions—the
City of Austin, Travis County
and the five-county Austin
MSA—have child poverty
rates that have declined since
2010.

#### Children and Youth Living Below the Poverty Level



### Equity

- Black and Hispanic children are 5 to 6 times more likely to live in poverty than White or Asian children.
- Child poverty rates exceed adult poverty rates for Hispanic and Black populations, while the opposite is true for Asian and White populations.

Poverty by Race & Ethnicity, Travis County





## Changing Demographics

Younger populations in Travis County are majority Hispanic, while older populations are majority White.

We must ensure that our young populations receive the education and training to prepare them to become our community's leaders and future workforce.


Race & Ethnicity by Age, Travis County, 2015

While there is an almost equal number of Hispanic and White children who do not live in poverty, there is a large number of Hispanic children who do live in poverty.



# Travis County Children Living in Poverty

- 58,111 children live in poverty
- 70% are Black or Hispanic
- 64% live with a single parent
- 55% live with at least one parent who is foreign born
- 91% of children living in poverty with two parents have at least one parent who is foreign born
