PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1948 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, roughly rectangular-plan, front-gabled frame house with paired and triple 1:1 fenestration; flat-roofed enclosed carport on the front of the house that was converted to interior space. From the back of the house, it appears that the original fenestration in the house was multi-lite metal-framed windows. The windows have been replaced on the front and sides of the house.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1948 by Plancon, Inc. The first owners and occupants were Charles C. and Dorothy H. Laughlin, who lived here for the rest of their lives. Charles C. Laughlin was a supervisor at Superior Dairies; Dorothy H. Laughlin was a Special Education teacher for the Austin Independent School District. After Charles Laughlin passed away in 1975, Dorothy continued to live here until her death in 2008.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984).

The house does not meet the criteria for landmark designation as set forth in City Code:

- a. **Architecture.** The house is a frame post World War II house with no architectural distinction.
- b. **Historical association**. The house was owned and occupied by Charles and Dorothy Laughlin from the date of its construction through the 2000s. Charles Laughlin was a supervisor at a local dairy; Dorothy Laughlin was a teacher for the Austin public schools. There do not appear to be significant historical associations.
- c. **Archaeology**. The house was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
- d. **Community value**. The house does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
- e. Landscape feature. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house lacks the architectural and historical significance necessary for individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Charles C. and Dorothy Laughlin (ca. 1948 - ca. 2008)

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Charles Laughlin as the 12-year old son of Scott and Maggie Laughlin, who rented their home in Taylor, Texas. Charles had been born in Texas and was the 4th of Scott and Maggie Laughlin's 6 children. Scott Laughlin, 40, had been born in Texas, and was a mule dealer. Maggie Laughlin, 34, had been born in Texas and had no occupation listed. None of the children had an occupation listed in the census report.

His 1975 death certificate shows that Charles Carrol Laughlin was born in Bartlett, Texas in 1917, and was a supervisor at Superior Dairies. He was living in this house at the time of his death.
