PUBLIC ACCESS

IT ALL STARTED IN 1972...

MARCH 31, 1972

The FCC issued a new cable TV ruling that required cable providers to provide channel space for Public, Educational and Government use.

1972

A student organization at the University of Texas was formed to move Public Access Television from concept to reality.





HISTORY OF AUSTIN'S

PUBLIC ACCES

Austin based Capital Cable Company provided channels 10 and 2 to PEG access.

JUNE 1973

Austin Community Television (ACTV) became a registered Non-Profit.

1973

ACTV first cable cast live and pre-recorded content from Mt. Larson in West Austin.

1990

Our current facility opened its doors

Austin Film Society assumes management of Austin Public

filmmaker, blogger, YouTube creator, small business owner, community organization member, creative media maker, musician, community activist, etc.


