







1. Population and Job growth.

- Texas leads the nation in population gain
- Urban counties are adding the most population while suburban counties are growing the fastest
- Austin's metropolitan region continues to surge in terms of population but job growth has slowed significantly
- City's share of regional population growth at an all time low

State's Share of Total National Population Growth, 16.9 million persons, 2010 to 2017




Percent Population Change: 2010 to 2016




Texas Counties: Total Population Growth, 2010 to 2016



Top 10 Biggest Growth Counties in Texas, 2010 to 2016













Austin MSA Population History: 1900 to 2015




Top 30 Fastest Growing Large (1.0 million+) Metropolitan Areas: 2015 to 2016




Share of Total Austin Metro Growth from Individual Counties, 2011 and 2016

Top 30 Largest Cities in the US












Households by Type, City of Austin, 2016




Families by Type, City of Austin, 2016





Households with Children by Type, City of Austin, 2016




Share of Households by Household Type, 2016




Share of Households by Household Type, 2000




1-Person HH Share of all Households, Top 30 US Cities, 2016
