## **Additional Backup Information:**

The purpose of this RCA is to request that Council approve the franchise agreement for Allegiance Mobile Health, LLC ("Allegiance") on the second reading.

Allegiance Mobile Health applied to be added as a new franchise provider for non-emergency transfer services within the City of Austin. Austin-Travis County EMS (ATCEMS) received an application from Allegiance Mobile Health in September of 2017, requesting a franchise for a five-year term. All the required application elements have been submitted and the application fee has been paid in full.

In order for a private ambulance company to provide non-emergency transfer services within the city limits of the City of Austin, the provider must hold a franchise from the City. Non-emergency transfers typically occur between skilled nursing facilities, hospitals, and private residences and are usually prescheduled by medical personnel. Currently, two companies hold such franchises, Acadian Ambulance Service, LLC, and American Medical Response of Texas,Inc.

The Austin-Travis County EMS Advisory Board reviewed the staff findings on November 1, 2017, and recommended Allegiance for a five year franchise in a vote of 7-0. The Board Recommendation is attached, along with a memo outlining staff findings.
