

AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

AND

EMS EMPLOYEE ASSOCIATION**

EFFECTIVE JUNE 23, 2016 -SEPTEMBER 30, 2017

1 The Medic II - Field written promotional exam will be conducted in accordance with this
2 Article. Candidates who pass the written promotional examination with a minimum score
3 determined and validated by the third party consultant, before the addition of seniority and/or
4 education points, if any, and shall be determined to have passed the examination, will proceed to
5 the next step of the examination process, which may include an optional Technical Skills
6 Evaluation.

7
8 **d) Optional Technical Skills Evaluation**

9 (1) If included, the Technical Skills Evaluation will be developed by a third party
10 consultant chosen by the Chief from a list generated by the Director of Civil Service. The
11 Technical Skills Evaluation exercises shall be based on job content and responsibility. The
12 Technical Skills Evaluation may include a scenario based assessment. The Consultant shall make
13 all final decisions concerning the design and implementation of the Technical Skills Evaluation.
14

15 (2) To remain in the process, all candidates must complete the Technical Skills
16 Evaluation, which may be administered on the same day or consecutive days depending on the
17 number of qualified applicants. There is no minimum passing score on the Technical Skills
18 Evaluation.
19

20 (3) Nothing in the Technical Skills Evaluation process may be appealed either to the
21 Civil Service Commission, a Hearing Examiner, or to District Court.
22

23 **e) Seniority**

24 Each candidate shall be entitled to up to a maximum of ten (10) seniority points to be
25 added to the written exam score, equivalent to one (1) point per year of continuous service prior
26 to date of the examination, which shall be prorated for partial years.
27

28 **f) Education**

29 (1) The following education points shall be added to each candidates score. These
30 points shall only be added to the Written Examination, and shall only apply to college degrees or
31 college credit from an accredited college or university. An accredited college or university is an
32 institution of higher education that is accredited or authorized by the Southern Association of
33 Colleges and Schools, the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, the New England
34 Association of Schools and Colleges, the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, the
35 Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges, or the Western Association of Schools and
36 Colleges. No cumulative points shall be allowed for more than one degree or college credits.

37 (i) Add 0.5 point for 60 college credits

38 (ii) Add 1.0 point for Bachelor Degree

39 (iii) Add 2.0 points for Masters Degree

42 (2) It is the responsibility of the candidate seeking education points to ensure that the

 3 points will be counted unless proper documentation is timely received.

43 **a) Promotional Procedure for Captain - Field**

1 Positions in the classification of Captain - Field shall be filled from an eligibility list
2 created by a promotional procedure consisting of a written examination and an Assessment Center
3 conducted in accordance with this Article.
4

5 **b) Eligibility**

6 Except as provided by Section 8 of this Article, each promotional examination for the
7 classification of Captain - Field shall be only open to each Medic II - Field who has continuously
8 held that classification for at least two years immediately before the examination.
9

10 **c) Written Examination**

11 The Captain - Field written promotional exam will be conducted in accordance with this
12 Article. Candidates who pass the written promotional examination with a minimum score
13 determined and validated by the third party consultant, before the addition seniority points, will
14 proceed to the next step of the examination process, which is an Assessment Center.
15

16 **d) Assessment Center**

17 The Captain - Field Assessment Center will be conducted in accordance with this Article.
18

19 **e) Seniority**

20 Each candidate shall be entitled to up to a maximum of ten (10) seniority points to be
21 added to the written exam score, equivalent to one (1) point per year of continuous service prior
22 to date of the examination, which shall be prorated for partial years.
23

24 **f) Education**

25 (1) The following education points shall be added to each candidate's score. These
26 points shall only be added to the Assessment Center score, and shall only apply to college degrees
27 or college credit from an accredited college or university. An accredited college or university is

24 **a) Promotional Procedure for Commander - Field**

25 Positions in the classification of Commander - Field shall be filled from an eligibility list
26 created by a promotional procedure consisting of a written examination and an Assessment Center
27 conducted in accordance with this Article.

28
29 **b) Eligibility**

30 Except as provided by Section 8 of this Article, each promotional examination for the
31 classification of Commander - Field shall be only open to each Captain - Field who has
32 continuously held that classification for at least two years immediately before the examination.

33
34
35 **c) Written Examination**

36 The Commander - Field written promotional exam will be conducted in accordance with
37 this Article. Candidates who pass the written promotional examination with a minimum score
38 determined and validated by the third party consultant, before the addition of seniority points, will
39 proceed to the next step of the examination process, which is an Assessment Center.

1 **d) Assessment Center**

2 The Commander - Field Assessment Center will be conducted in accordance with this
3 Article.

4
5 **e) Seniority**

6 Each candidate shall be entitled to up to a maximum of ten (10) seniority points to be
7 added to the written exam score, equivalent to one (1) point per year of continuous service prior
8 to date of the examination, which shall be prorated for partial years.

9
10 **f) Education**

10 **Section 4. Medic II - Communications**

11 **a) Promotional Procedure for Medic II - Communications**

12 Positions in the classification of Medic II - Communications shall be filled from an
13 eligibility list created by a promotional procedure consisting of a written examination and, at the
14 discretion of the Chief, may include a Technical Skills Evaluation conducted in accordance with
15 this Article.
16

17 **b) Eligibility**

18 Except as provided by Section 8(b) of this Article, each promotional examination for the
19 classification of Medic II - Communications shall be only open to each Medic I - Communications
20 who has continuously held that classification for at least one (1) year immediately before the
21 examination, and at the time of the examination has successfully completed the probationary
22 period.
23

24 **c) Written Examination**

25 The Medic II - Communications written promotional exam will be conducted in
26 accordance with this Article. Candidates who receive a minimum score determined and validated
27 by the third party consultant, before the addition of seniority and/or education points, if any, shall
28 be determined to have passed the examination, and will proceed to the next step of the examination
29 process, which may include an optional Technical Skills Evaluation.
30

31 **d) Optional Technical Skills Evaluation**

32 (1) If included, the Technical Skills Evaluation will be developed by a third party
33 consultant chosen by the Chief from a list generated by the Director of Civil Service. The Technical
34 Skills Evaluation exercises shall be based on job content and responsibility. The Technical Skills

20 Positions in the classification of Captain - Communications shall be filled from an
21 eligibility list created by a promotional procedure consisting of a written examination and an
22 Assessment Center conducted in accordance with this Article.

24 **b) Eligibility**

25 Except as provided by Section 8 of this Article, each promotional examination for the
26 classification of Captain - Communications shall be only open to each Medic II - Communications
27 who has continuously held that classification for at least two years immediately before the
28 examination.

29
30 **c) Written Examination**

31 The Captain - Communications written promotional exam will be conducted in
32 accordance with this Article. Candidates who pass the written promotional examination with a
33 minimum score determined and validated by the third party consultant, before the addition of
34 seniority points, will proceed to the next step of the examination process, which is an Assessment
35 Center.

37 **d) Assessment Center**

38 The Captain - Communications Assessment Center will be conducted in accordance with
39 this Article.

Section 6. Commander – Communications

a) Promotional Procedure for Commander - Communications

Positions in the classification of Commander - Communications shall be filled from an eligibility list created by a promotional procedure consisting of a written examination and an Assessment Center conducted in accordance with this Article.

b) Eligibility

Except as provided by Section 8 of this Article, each promotional examination for the classification of Commander - Communications shall be only open to each Captain - Communications who has continuously held that classification for at least two years immediately before the examination.

c) Written Examination

The Commander - Communications written promotional exam will be conducted in accordance with this Article. Candidates who pass the written promotional examination with a minimum score determined and validated by the third party consultant, before the addition of seniority points, will proceed to the next step of the examination process, which is an Assessment Center.

d) Assessment Center

The Commander - Communications Assessment Center will be conducted in accordance with this Article.

e) Seniority

Each candidate shall be entitled to up to a maximum of ten (10) seniority points to be added to the written exam score, equivalent to one (1) point per year of continuous service prior to date of the examination, which shall be prorated for partial years.

f) Education

(1) The following education points shall be added to each candidate's written exam score. These points shall only be added to the Assessment Center score, and only apply to college degrees from an accredited college or university. An accredited college or university is an institution of higher education that is accredited or authorized by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges, or the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. No cumulative points shall be allowed for more than one degree.

3 (2) Upon vacancy, positions in the classifications of Assistant Chief shall be filled by
4 use of the appointment process specified in LGC Sections 143.014 and 143.311. A person
5 appointed to such positions shall have all rights and remedies afforded under LGC Section
6 143.014(g)-(h). The Chief may remove without cause a person appointed to Assistant Chief from
7 the Assistant Chief position, subject to the person's rights and remedies under LGC Section
8 143.014(g).
9

10 (3) The employees currently occupying the positions of Division Chief and Assistant
11 Chief, and the employees appointed to those positions in accordance with this Article, will have
12 full civil service protection.
13

14 **b) Eligibility**

15 In addition to the EMS equivalent of qualifications listed in LGC Section 143.014(e), the
16 Chief shall establish, in writing, any additional required qualifying criteria for persons to be
17 appointed under this Section.
18

19 **Section 8. Crossover Transfers and Promotions**

20 **a) Crossover Transfer**

21 (1) A Medic I with a minimum of one (1) year of service within either the Field or
22 Communications Division, may request a transfer to a Medic I position within the alternate
23 division. A Medic I wishing to transfer divisions must meet the minimum qualifications for the
24 alternate division prior to being transferred.
25

26 (2) A Medic II with a minimum of one (1) year of service as a Medic II within either
27 the Field or Communications Division, may request a transfer to a Medic II position within the
28 alternate division. A Medic II wishing to transfer divisions must meet the minimum qualifications
29 for the alternate division prior to being transferred.
30

31 (3) A Medic II who has requested a transfer pursuant to this Section shall be placed on
32 a transfer list in the order in which the transfer request was received by the Department's HR
33 Manager. In the event of a tie, placement on the list shall be based on tenure in the Department.
34 The Department may develop additional tiebreakers if necessary. Subject to subsections 4 and 5,
35 an eligible Medic II on the list will be transferred to the next Medic II vacancy in the alternate
36 division in the order in which he or she was placed on the list.
37

38 (4) The transfer of a Medic II to the alternate division shall not deny promotional
39 opportunities otherwise available to a Medic I in that division under the following conditions:

40 (i) A Medic II who has requested a transfer shall not be eligible to fill such
41 vacancy if, at the time the vacancy is created, a promotional eligibility list
42 exists for that vacancy.

43 (ii) A Medic II who has requested a transfer shall not be eligible to fill such
44 vacancy if, at the time the vacancy is created, a qualified Medic I has

1 registered for the promotional examination for that vacancy in accordance
2 with Civil Service Commission Rule 7.06, and the registered Medic I
3 becomes eligible to otherwise promote to such vacancy.
4

5 (5) Authorization to transfer pursuant to this Section is within the sole discretion of the
6 Chief.
7

8 (6) A Medic I who transfers divisions shall not be eligible to promote to the next
9 highest classification until the person has continuously held the classification of Medic I in the
10 division to which the person was transferred for at least one (1) year immediately before the written
11 examination. For all other purposes, a Medic I who transfers divisions retains their seniority within
12 the Department.
13

14 (7) A Medic II who transfers divisions shall not be eligible to promote to the next
15 highest classification until the person has continuously held the classification of Medic II in the
16 division to which the person was transferred for at least one (1) year immediately before the written
17 examination. For all other purposes, a Medic II who transfers divisions retains their seniority
18 within the Department.
19

20 (8) A transfer list created under this Section shall survive the expiration of this
21 AGREEMENT, and shall remain in full force and effect, only if a successor AGREEMENT has
22 been ratified and is effective on the date after the expiration of this AGREEMENT. Otherwise,
23 the transfer list shall expire upon the expiration of this AGREEMENT.
24

25 **b) Voluntary Crossover Demotion and Transfer**

26 (1) A Medic within either the Field or Communications Division may voluntarily
27 accept a demotion and transfer to a Medic I position within the alternate division. A Medic wishing
28 to demote and transfer divisions pursuant to this Section must meet the minimum qualifications
29 for the position in the alternate division prior to being transferred.
30

31 (2) Authorization for a voluntary demotion and transfer pursuant to this Section may
32 be delayed or denied if the Chief determines that such demotion and transfer is not in the best
33 interest of the Department. Reasons for delay or denial include, but are not limited to:

- 34 (i) Balance of the workforce;
 - 35 (ii) The number of vacancies within the affected classifications; or
 - 36 (iii) Disciplinary reasons
- 37

38 (3) A Medic who voluntarily demotes and transfers divisions shall not be eligible to
39 promote to the next highest classification until the person has continuously held the classification
40 in the division to which the person was transferred for at least one (1) year immediately before the
41 written examination. For all other purposes, a person who voluntarily demotes and transfers
42 divisions retains their seniority within the Department.
43

44 **c) Crossover Promotion**

1 A Medic I who has continuously held the classification of Medic I in either Field or
2 Communications Division for at least two (2) years immediately before the written examination,
3 may compete in a promotional process for the classification of Medic II within the alternate
4 division. A Medic I wishing to promote to the alternate division must meet all other minimum
5 qualifications for Medic II in the alternate division prior to taking the written examination.
6

7 **d) Step Placement Following Voluntary Crossover Demotion and Transfer**

8 A Medic who elects to voluntarily demote and transfer to an alternate division shall
9 remain at the same step placement that the medic held at the time of the voluntary demotion.
10

11 **e) No Grievance or Appeal**

12 It is expressly understood and agreed that nothing in this Section is subject to the
13 grievance process set forth in this AGREEMENT, nor may be appealed either to the Civil Service
14 Commission, a Hearing Examiner, or to District Court.
15

16 **Section 9. Written Examination Points**

17 a) Except appointments to the classifications of Division Chief and Assistant Chief, all
18 candidates for promotion shall first take a written examination. The maximum score for the written
19 examination shall be one hundred (100) points. Each candidate who receives a minimum score
20 determined and validated by the third party consultant, before the addition of seniority or education
21 points, if any, shall be determined to have passed the examination. The written examination shall
22 consist of questions relating to the duties of the rank to be filled, as contained in reading material
23 selected by the Chief. The CITY must engage an independent consultant to professionally develop
24 the written examination questions after consultations with the Chief, or designees, and the Director
25 of Civil Service. The CITY will make a reasonable effort to ensure that the examination will be
26 validated either before or after the examination is given. Prior to being administered, the finalized
27 examination shall be kept in a safe and secure manner.
28

29 b) The CITY shall make reasonable efforts to provide a six (6) month study time window
30 prior to promotional examinations, but it is recognized that expiration or exhaustion of a list may
31 necessitate an earlier examination.
32

33 **Section 10. Assessment Center Process**

34 a) The Assessment Center process shall only apply to candidates for the following
35 classifications, who pass the written promotional examination, with a minimum score determined
36 and validated by the third party consultant, before the addition of seniority or education points, if
37 any:

- 38 (1) Captain – Field
- 39 (2) Commander - Field
- 40 (3) Captain – Communications
- 41 (4) Commander – Communications
- 42

1 b) Prior to the written examination being administered, the Chief shall establish assessment
2 criteria based on job content and responsibility. The Director of Civil Service will generate a list
3 of consultants, and will review that list with the Chief. The Chief shall also appoint three (3)
4 members to serve on an Assessment Center Review Committee, (“ACRC”), plus one (1) alternate.
5 The ASSOCIATION shall also select three (3) individuals to serve on the ACRC and one (1)
6 alternate. All ACRC members shall be selected from the tested rank or above. No ACRC member
7 shall be eligible for a promotional process in which they served as a member. The ACRC shall
8 meet and consider the list of consultants and recommend the Assessment Center Consultant from
9 the list, subject to Council approval pursuant to CITY purchasing policies and procedures.

10
11 c) After the Assessment Center Consultant has been selected, the Consultant will orient the
12 ACRC. The Consultant will confer with both the Chief and the ACRC on the needs or issues
13 affecting the design of the Assessment Center. Any input from the ASSOCIATION will be
14 summarized by the ACRC and made available to anyone who requests it. The Consultant shall
15 make all final decisions concerning the design and implementation of the Assessment Center.

16
17 d) The consultant will design the Assessment Center from among the following exercises:

- 18 In Basket
- 19 Problem Solving/Analysis
- 20 Written and Oral Resumes/Structured Interviews
- 21 Role Playing
- 22 Memo/Report Writing
- 23 Oral Presentation/Plan Preparation
- 24 Staff Meeting
- 25 Special Event/Operations

26
27 The consultant is not required to utilize all of the exercises, but may select the exercises
28 or combine the listed exercises into one or more exercises that are best suited for the particular
29 rank.

30
31 e) The Consultant also selects the assessors, who shall meet the following criteria:

- 32 (1) Shall not be related to any candidates for promotion;
- 33 (2) Shall not be known to, beyond mere acquaintance, any candidates for promotion;
- 34 (3) Shall have two (2) years of experience in the promoted or equivalent rank, and
- 35 (4) Shall not be a current or former employee of the City of Austin.

36
37 f) The Consultant shall conduct an orientation for candidates prior to administering the
38 Assessment Center. The Consultant may deem the orientation mandatory, and all candidates must
39 attend in order to participate, if it is declared mandatory. If the consultant deems an orientation to
40 be mandatory, at least two (2) orientations shall be scheduled. If a mandatory orientation is
41 scheduled during a candidate’s work time, he/she will be permitted to attend.

42
43 g) The assessors selected by the Consultant will assess the candidates for the rank. The
44 assessors shall award up to one hundred (100) points to each candidate participating in the

1 Assessment Center. The assessment sessions will be videotaped, and candidates may review their
2 own session pursuant to procedures established by the Director of Civil Service, provided that
3 candidates are given up to four (4) hours, which may be provided in smaller increments of time,
4 to review their assessment session. The Director of Civil Service shall make available blocks of
5 time for candidates to review examination results from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and at least two (2)
6 evening options until 10:00 p.m. shall be provided. However, these time periods need not be kept
7 available or staffed unless the times are reserved in advance. Examination reviews will be
8 conducted on the candidate's off-duty time. Copies of the videotapes will not be given to the
9 candidate. Nothing in the Assessment Center process may be appealed either to the Civil Service
10 Commission, a Hearing Examiner, or to District Court.

11
12 h) To remain in the process, all candidates must complete the Assessment Center, which
13 may be administered on the same day or consecutive days depending on the number of qualified
14 applicants. There is no minimum passing score on the Assessment Center.

15 16 **Section 11. Eligibility Lists**

17 a) All promotional eligibility lists created under this Article shall be constructed, with the
18 highest total score being ranked number one and descending in numerical order.

19
20 b) All promotional eligibility lists shall be valid for twenty-four (24) months from the date
21 that the eligibility list is initially posted, even after termination of this AGREEMENT.

22
23 c) If a written promotional examination for a rank has been given prior to the expiration of
24 this AGREEMENT, the promotional process for that rank may continue to completion, the
25 expiration of this AGREEMENT notwithstanding, and the resulting eligibility list shall have a life
26 of twenty-four (24) months from the eligibility list is initially posted. In the event of any
27 occurrence which results in a change to the eligibility list, the changed list shall be effective on the
28 day the original list was effective, even after termination of this AGREEMENT. In the event of a
29 clerical or electronic error in computing the test scores, the expiration date of any promotional
30 examination eligibility list may be amended by written agreement between the President of the
31 ASSOCIATION and the City Manager.

32 33 **Section 12. Appeals Criteria Committee**

34 a) An Appeals Criteria Committee (ACC) shall determine the criteria for what may be
35 appealed to the Civil Service Commission following all written promotional examinations. The
36 ACC shall establish appeal criteria which will be used for all written examinations held during the
37 term of this Agreement. The ACC, composed of seven (7) individuals, shall be appointed as
38 follows:

- 39 (1) Three (3) members appointed by ASSOCIATION, each having taken at least one
40 (1) promotional exam;
41 (2) Two (2) members appointed by the Chief, each having taken at least one (1)
42 promotional exam;
43 (3) One (1) member appointed by the Director of Civil Service; and
44 (4) One (1) member appointed by the Chair of the Civil Service Commission.
45

1 b) A simple majority of the ACC shall approve the criteria. The Chief may reconvene the
2 ACC if, after an eligibility list has been established, it appears that clarification or modification of
3 the criteria is warranted. The criteria approved by the ACC shall not be appealable to either the
4 Civil Service Commission, a Hearing Examiner, or to District Court.

5
6 **Section 13. Appeal Process after Written Examination**

7 Within 72 hours after a promotional examination is held, the Commission shall post the
8 individual raw scores. Any candidate who has taken a written promotional examination may,
9 within seven (7) City of Austin business days of the posting of the written promotional exam
10 results, review his/her examination results. The process shall be established by the Director of
11 Civil Service; provided, however, that each candidate who has taken a promotional examination
12 may have up to four (4) hours to review his/her examination, write, and submit the appeal, if any,
13 which must be based on the appeal criteria approved by the ACC. Once an appeal is filed, it shall
14 be assigned a number and processed anonymously. The candidate may obtain a copy of his or her
15 appeal. The Director of Civil Service shall make available blocks of time for candidates to review
16 examination results from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and evening options until 10:00 p.m. shall be
17 provided. However, these time periods need not be kept available or staffed unless the times are
18 reserved in advance. Examination reviews will be conducted on the candidate's off- duty time.
19 There will be no appeal to the Civil Service Commission, a Hearing Examiner, or to District Court
20 of any facet of the examination review process.

21
22 **Section 14. Review by Employee Review Committee**

23 a) An Employee Review Committee (ERC) will be appointed to screen written examination
24 appeals to the Civil Service Commission, applying the criteria established by the ACC to determine
25 which appeals should be rejected because they do not meet the criteria. Assuring for diversity as
26 is practical and possible the ERC shall be comprised of five (5) members as follows:

27 (1) Four (4) members of the rank of the promotional exam or higher, two (2) each
28 appointed by the ASSOCIATION and the Chief; and

29
30 (2) One (1) member appointed by the Director of Civil Service.

31
32 b) Appeals may advance from the ERC to the Civil Service Commission by a vote of a
33 simple majority of the ERC. The ERC will not make any statement, assertion, or recommendation
34 regarding the validity of an appeal or subsequent Civil Service Commission action. There will be
35 no appeal to the Civil Service Commission, a Hearing Examiner, or to District Court of the ERC's
36 examination appeal determinations or from the Civil Service Commission's written examination
37 appeal decisions.

38
39 **Section 15. Time Limit to Fill Vacant Positions**

40 It is expressly understood and agreed that during the term of this AGREEMENT, the
41 provisions in Chapter 143.036(d) and (e) and 143.014(f) of the Local Government Code
42 prescribing time limits for filling vacancies shall be expanded to one hundred and twenty (120)
43 calendar days after the date the vacancy occurs. This Section shall only apply to the filling of
44 vacancies in the following classifications:

- 1 (1) Captain – Field
- 2 (2) Commander – Field
- 3 (3) Captain – Communications
- 4 (4) Commander – Communications

5

6 **Section 16. Committee on the Assessment Center Process**

7 The CITY and the ASSOCIATION shall each appoint two (2) persons to a committee that
8 shall schedule a meeting with the participants in each Assessment Center process to discuss the
9 strengths and weaknesses perceived by the participants, after completion of the process. The
10 Committee may recommend changes in the procedures set out in this Agreement.

11

12 **Section 17. Military Promotions/Demotions**

13 The following changes are made to Sections 143.036 and 143.072 of the Texas Local
14 Government Code:

15 a) When a Medic is promoted as the result of a vacancy created by a military leave of
16 absence, and the Medic on military leave returns to active duty in the Department, the person who
17 filled the most recent vacancy at that rank shall be the one who is demoted to the next lowest
18 classification and placed on a reinstatement list, with such rights as prescribed in this Article.

19

20 b) The same result applies to all other promotions in lower ranks which resulted from the
21 first promotion and subsequent demotion.

22

23 c) All other provisions of Sections 143.036 and 143.072 not specifically changed by this
24 Agreement shall remain in effect.

25

26 **Section 18. Vacancy Created by Indefinite Suspension**

27 a) Notwithstanding any provision in this Article or any provision in Local Government
28 Code Chapter 143, an indefinite suspension of a Medic (despite any pending appeal) shall create
29 a vacancy, but shall not expand the size of the classified service. In the event that an indefinite
30 suspension is overturned on appeal and the Medic is reinstated to active duty in the Department,
31 the person who filled the most recent vacancy at that rank shall be the one who is demoted to the
32 next lowest classification and placed on a reinstatement list, with such rights as prescribed in this
33 Article.

34

35 b) The same result applies to all other promotions in lower ranks which resulted from the
36 first promotion and subsequent demotion.

37

38 **Section 19. Failure to Timely Credential after Promotion or Crossover Transfer**

39 a) If a person fails to credential to unrestricted status by the Medical Director within the
40 established time period following a crossover promotion or crossover transfer, the person shall be
41 demoted to the position held at the time of the promotion or transfer. A demotion under this
42 Section shall not expand the size of the classified service.

43

44 b) If a vacancy exists in the classification to which a person is demoted under this Section,

1 the person shall fill the vacancy. If no vacancy exists, the person who filled the most recent
2 vacancy at that classification shall be the one who is demoted to the next lowest classification and
3 placed on a reinstatement list, with such rights as prescribed in this Article.

4
5 c) The same result applies to all other promotions in lower ranks that resulted from the first
6 promotion and subsequent demotion.

7
8 d) A demotion under this Section shall not be appealable either to the Civil Service
9 Commission, a Hearing Examiner, or to District Court.

10
11 **Section 20. Reinstatement List**

12 a) There shall be only one reinstatement list for each classification for persons demoted by
13 virtue of Sections 17, 18 and 19 of this Article.

14
15 b) Any person placed on a reinstatement list pursuant to Section 17, 18 and 19 of this Article
16 shall remain on the list indefinitely.

17
18 c) Persons on the list shall be entitled to reinstatement to the classification from which they
19 were demoted in the same order as the demotion occurred, which results in the last demoted at that
20 rank being the first reinstated. Reinstatements must occur off of the reinstatement list for that
21 classification before any promotions from a promotional eligibility list. Until such reinstatements
22 occur and the reinstatement list is exhausted, there shall be no “vacancy” created at that
23 classification for the purpose of any promotional eligibility list.

24
25 d) Except for persons eligible for reinstatement at an entry classification, time spent on a
26 reinstatement list shall not be considered a break in service for civil service purposes, including,
27 but not limited to eligibility for future promotional examinations. Reinstatement is subject to
28 successful completion of the OMD re-credentialing process.

29
30 **Section 21. Effect on Current Eligibility Lists**

31 It is expressly understood and agreed that the promotional process set out in this Article shall
32 not apply to persons in a promotional process initiated prior to the effective date of this Agreement,
33 and shall not extend the expiration date of an existing Eligibility List.

34
35 **Section 22. Effect of Contract Expiration**

36 The provisions of this Article shall remain in full force and effect after expiration of this
37 AGREEMENT as to:

38 a) All promotional eligibility lists created during this AGREEMENT; and

39 b) All reinstatement lists created pursuant to this Article.

40
41
42
43 **PART D. EMT-P CERTIFICATION PROGRAM**

1 **Section 23. Purpose**

2 The EMT-P Certification Program (the “Certification Program”) established by this Article
3 promotes the City’s goals of improving customer service and investing in the workforce by
4 providing assistance to employees who take ATCEMS career-enhancing courses designed to
5 obtain Texas Department of State Health Services (TDSHS) certification as an Emergency
6 Medical Technician-Paramedic (EMT-P).
7

8 **Section 24. Definitions**

9 In Part D of this Article:

10 a) “Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic” or “EMT-P” shall have the same meaning
11 as provided by the Texas Administrative Code, Title 25, Part 1, Chapter 157, Subchapter A, Rule
12 157.2 (35).
13

14 b) “Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic certification” or “EMT-P certification”
15 means certification by the Texas Department of State Health Services at the EMT-P level.
16

17 c) “Certification Program” means a Department designated program of course work and
18 field/clinical experience required by the current national paramedic education standards and
19 competencies in the National EMS Education Standards, as defined by DOT, to become eligible
20 for certification as an EMT-P.
21

22 d) “Tuition cost” means the cost per student, as determined by the Department, of the
23 Certification Program.
24

25 **Section 25. Eligibility Requirements**

26 a) This Certification Program is available to all Medics that:

- 27 (1) Have successfully completed their probationary period,
28 (2) Have a current EMT or EMT-I certification from the TDSHS or current EMT,
29 EMT-I or AEMT certification from the National Registry, and
30 (3) Have not obtained TDSHS or National Registry certification as an Emergency
31 Medical Technician-Paramedic or Licensed Paramedic.
32

33 b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), this Certification Program is not available to any Medic
34 that:

- 35 (1) Has received a disciplinary suspension in the six (6) months immediately preceding
36 the date of the Certification Program, or
37 (2) Has a Modified Credential Status by the Office of Medical Director.

38 c) Eligible Medics who apply for placement in the Certification Program shall take an
39 assessment test developed by the Department. Medics shall be placed on the eligibility list in
40 numerical order of each Medic’s raw score from the assessment test, with the highest score being
41 first on the list. There shall be no cut score. In the event of a tie placement on the list shall be
42 based on tenure in the Department. The Department may develop additional tiebreakers if

1 necessary. Each eligibility list created for placement in the Certification Program shall be effective
2 only for that Certification Program.

3
4 **Section 26. The Certification Program**

5 a) The Department will conduct at least one (1) Certification Program prior to the expiration
6 date of this Agreement. Participation in the Certification Program is voluntary and shall not be
7 counted as on-duty regular hours. A participating Medic shall not be compensated for time spent
8 outside of on-duty regular work hours in connection with the Certification Program.

9
10 b) This Article shall apply only to a Certification Program designated by the Department.

11
12 c) The number of participants in the designated Certification Program shall not exceed
13 fifteen (15) Medics per fiscal year.

14
15 **Section 27. Two Year Service Requirement and Tuition Cost Reimbursement**

16 a) Requirements for continued service with the CITY are an assurance that the CITY will
17 benefit from employee participation in this Certification Program. A two (2) year service
18 requirement begins on the date the Medic begins the Certification Program.

19
20 b) If a Medic leaves employment with the Department *for any reason*, other than a
21 compensable line of duty injury or illness, before the Medic's service requirement is completed,
22 the Medic must reimburse the CITY all or part of the Certification Program tuition cost in one of
23 the following ways:

24 (1) If the Medic has worked for the less than one year of the service requirement, the
25 Medic shall reimburse the CITY the full amount of the Medic's tuition cost.

26
27 (2) If the Medic has worked at least one year, but less than two years, of the service
28 requirement, the Medic will reimburse the CITY 50% of the amount of the Medic's
29 tuition cost.

30
31 (3) Each Medic shall be provided in writing the amount of the tuition cost at least 14
32 days before the Medic begins the Certification Program.

33
34 A Medic who is reinstated from an indefinite suspension by the Civil Service
35 Commission, a Hearing Examiner, or final court order shall not be required to reimburse the City
36 for any amount of the Medic's tuition cost.

37
38 c) If a Medic fails to successfully complete the Certification Program, the Medic shall
39 reimburse the CITY the full amount of the Medic's tuition cost.

40
41 d) If a separation of service or termination of employment occurs (voluntary or involuntary)
42 and a reimbursement amount is owed by the Medic, and the Medic does not otherwise repay the
43 amount, the Medic agrees to have the reimbursement amount deducted from the Medic's
44 paycheck(s) and/or monies owed for accumulated benefits that are paid after the termination
45 decision occurs. To facilitate such payment on the part of the Medic, he/she shall submit, at the

1 time the Medic begins the Certification Program, a signed payroll deduction agreement authorizing
2 the above deductions. The failure to submit a payroll deduction agreement shall not waive the
3 CITY'S right to reimbursement.

4
5 e) A service requirement is *not* an assurance of continued employment by the City.
6

7 **Section 28. Medic Work and Certification Program Schedules**

8 The Certification Program will typically be scheduled during non-working hours. If a
9 Certification Program schedule would interfere with the Medic's work schedule, the Department
10 will attempt to accommodate the Medic's work and Certification Program schedule subject to the
11 operational and staffing needs of the Department. Final approval for flexible scheduling will be
12 at the discretion of the Chief.
13

14 **Section 29. Continuing Education**

15 a) Mutual Interest

16 The ASSOCIATION and the CITY share a mutual interest in the continuing education
17 of EMS personnel for quality improvement, operational needs, changes in the practice of medicine
18 and recertification of licenses. Both Parties recognize that the creation, planning, development
19 and delivery of continuing education is a management right.

20 b) National Registry EMT Recertification

21 The Department is committed to continuing to provide a curriculum consistent with
22 National Registry EMT recertification of its personnel. To that end and consistent with the
23 continuing education curriculum implemented in FY 2015-2016, the Department will include
24 continuing education that meets recertification requirements for National Registry EMT in FY
25 2016-2017. Not all recertification courses will be offered per fiscal year and the City shall not be
26 required to meet the recertification timing needs of any individual Medic. At the Department's
27 discretion, such courses may be included in the Department's mandatory continuing education or
28 may be offered on a voluntary basis. The Department will provide at least two National Standards
29 courses during the Department's mandatory continuing education. If offered on a voluntary basis,
30 time spent outside of on-duty regular work hours in connection with these courses shall not be
31 counted as on-duty regular hours and a participating Medic shall not be compensated for such
32 hours.
33

1
2 **AMENDMENT SECTION 2:**

3
4 Article 13 of the AGREEMENT is hereby amended to read as follows:
5

6
7 **ARTICLE 13**
8 **HIRING PROCESSES**
9

10 **Part A. Application of Chapter 143 Processes**

11 The ASSOCIATION, recognizing the CITY’S need for flexibility in the hiring process,
12 hereby agrees to the deviations from Chapter 143 hiring procedures specifically authorized by this
13 Article. Except as allowed by this Article, the CITY will comply with the hiring procedures
14 specified in Chapter 143, and retains all prerogatives granted to it by the statutory procedures.
15

16 **Part B. Initial Hiring Process**

17
18 **Section 1. Submission of Proper Application**

19 a) In order to be considered for the position of Medic I each applicant must first submit a
20 proper application as defined by the Department. A proper application shall include, but not be
21 limited to, information on personal history, criminal history, driving record and age. The
22 information submitted shall be used by the Department to determine whether the applicant meets
23 the minimum qualifications to proceed to the testing phase of the process.
24

25 b) The Chief shall establish the eligibility requirements for applicants for the position of
26 Medic I, consistent with Chapter 143 and this Agreement.
27

28 **Section 2. Screening and Testing of Applicants**

29 a) The Chief will develop and implement the screening and testing procedures used to
30 determine whether an applicant will be offered a position as a Medic I in an EMS Academy. The
31 screening and testing procedures will include, at a minimum, a structured Oral Interview Board
32 and a background investigation. Nothing in this Agreement or in Chapter 143 will restrict the
33 nature of the tests administered to applicants or the procedures used to administer those tests.
34

35 b) Applicants who successfully complete all of the screening and testing procedures will be
36 placed on an eligibility list per Department policy. Applicants on the eligibility list may be offered
37 a position as a Medic I in an EMS Academy.
38

39 c) Each eligibility list created as a result of the process described in this Section shall remain
40 effective for twenty-four (24) months after certification by the Director of Civil Service, or his or
41 her designee.
42
43

1 **Section 3. Internship Program**

2 The Department may create and implement an Internship Program for individuals who are
3 interested in becoming a Medic I. Anyone admitted into the Internship Program must pass the
4 same screening and testing procedures as applicants for the position of Medic I, either at the
5 beginning or at the end of their participation in the Program. The duration of the Internship
6 Program will be at least the equivalent of a college semester. Any intern who successfully
7 completes the Internship Program shall be placed at the top of the current or next eligibility list for
8 hire as a Medic I. Up to fifty percent (50%) of each Academy class may consist of interns who
9 successfully completed the Internship Program.

10
11 **Section 4. Effect on Present Medic I Classes**

12 It is specifically understood and agreed that the hiring process set out in this Agreement shall
13 not apply to persons hired before the effective date of this Agreement.

14
15 **Section 5. Probationary Period**

16 The “at will” probationary period of individuals filling beginning positions in the EMS
17 Department shall begin, under this Agreement, on the date the Medic I is hired and shall end at the
18 expiration of twelve (12) months. Any leave taken by a probationary Medic I, including but not
19 limited to injury leave, FMLA leave, or sick leave, shall extend this probationary period by the
20 length of the leave taken. (Approved vacation leave, other than FMLA, will not so extend the
21 probationary period.)

22
23
24 **Part C. Modified Hiring Process**

25
26 **Section 1. Applicability**

27 a) Field Division

28 The Modified Hiring Process for the Field Division applies only to the hiring of
29 individuals that, as of their date of their application, have a current Texas Department of State
30 Health Services certification as an Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic or Licensed
31 Paramedic.

32
33 b) Communications Division

34 The Modified Hiring Process for the Communications Division applies only to the hiring
35 of individuals that have 911 communications experience.

36
37 **Section 2. Eligibility Requirements**

38 a) Except as noted within this Article:

39 (1) The Chief shall establish the eligibility requirements for applicants for the Modified
40 Hiring Process.

41
42

1 (2) The requirements need not be the same as those established by Chapter 143 or those
2 applicable to applicants for the position of Medic I, except as noted within this
3 Article.
4

5 b) The Chief or the Chief's designee may, at his or her sole discretion, deny the application
6 of any applicant for the Modified Hiring Process and may determine whether a particular applicant
7 meets the eligibility requirements in accordance with the provisions in this Article.
8

9 **Section 3. Selection and Placement**

10 a) The Chief shall establish the selection criteria and procedures for the Modified Hiring
11 Process. The criteria need not be the same as those established by Chapter 143 or those applicable
12 to applicants for the position of Medic I in the Department's regular Academy. Applicants who
13 meet the selection criteria and procedures may be hired without being placed on an eligibility list.
14

15 b) Upon hire, the applicant will be placed in the position of Medic I regardless of any rank
16 or position the individual previously held in another agency.
17

18 **Section 4. Modified Hiring, Training and Probation**

19 a) The Chief shall establish the training requirements for individuals hired through the
20 Modified Hiring Process. All individuals hired through the Modified Hiring Process must
21 successfully complete the training established by the Chief.
22

23 b) Each individual hired through the Modified Hiring Process shall successfully complete a
24 probationary period of at least twelve (12) months from date of hire.
25

26 **Section 5. Civil Service Status**

27 a) An individual who successfully completes the probationary period will become a full-
28 fledged civil service employee with civil service protection. Until completion of probation, each
29 Medic I hired through this Modified Hiring Process is an at-will employee who may be discharged
30 by the Chief at any time, without right of appeal.
31

32 b) Until completion of probation, a Medic I hired through the Modified Hiring Process is
33 excluded from the coverage of discipline or grievance Articles in this Agreement.
34

35 **Section 6. Pay and Seniority**

36 a) The beginning pay rate for each Medic I hired through the Modified Hiring Process shall
37 be that of a Medic I with two (2) years' experience in the Department.
38

39 b) Regardless of the pay rate established for each Medic I hired through the Modified Hiring
40 Process, seniority for purposes of longevity pay shall begin on the date of hire as a Medic I with
41 the Department.
42

43 c) Movement through the pay schedule shall not take into account initial placement in the
44 step plan, but shall only be based on time in service.

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Section 7. Promotional Eligibility

A Medic I hired through the Modified Hiring Process must meet the same promotional eligibility requirements as a Medic I hired through the Department’s regular initial hiring process.

Section 8. Implementation

The Modified Hiring Process described by this Article may be used at any time, for any number of applicants, as authorized by the Chief.

Part D. Additional Provisions

Section 1. Benefit of the Bargain

The ASSOCIATION and the CITY share the goal of recruiting and hiring the most qualified applicants to become Medic I personnel. The parties agree that the degree of flexibility incorporated into this Article is of benefit to both parties.

Section 2. Effect of Contract Expiration

The provisions of this Article shall remain in full force and effect after expiration of this Agreement as to:

- a) Any hiring process which has been commenced in substantial reliance upon the provisions of this Article;
- b) The length of the “at will” probationary period for individuals in that status prior to the expirations of this Agreement;
- c) Any eligibility list created under the terms of this Article will remain in effect for 24 months, notwithstanding the expiration of this Agreement;
- d) Any interns who are participating in the Internship Program at the expiration of this Agreement may be placed at the top of the first eligibility list created after expiration of this Agreement.

Section 3. Preemption

Nothing in this Article shall prevent the CITY from complying with any provision of federal law in connection with the hiring process.
