RefashionNYC

- In-building donation boxes for offices, apartments, schools, commercial businesses
- Department of Sanitation NY visits building to determines bin needs
- Non-profit Housing Works collects & sorts material in Queens warehouse
- Donations benefit Housing Works' efforts to combat homelessness and HIV/AIDS
- Tax receipts are available on the bin



San Francisco: Bag in the bin

- Ask for good condition items to be donated
- "RecycleWhere" search engine helps find donation spots
- All other textiles can be placed in a clear plastic bag and then placed inside the recycling bin.



ReThreadDC

- Focus = helping non-profits promote their reuse effort
- Resident education through social media, events calendar, newsletter
- Non-profits apply to be Donation Partners.
- Partners are listed on website, events calendar, receive initiative updates. In exchange, they promote the ReThread initiative, attend meetings, provide quarterly updates and share data on annual volumes collected.



Phoenix: Scheduled pick-ups

- RFP for curbside service using a customer relationship management (CRM) software tool to enable households to schedule a collection
- Work in progress
- Scheduled to go to their Council for approval in May
