Demolition by neglect is in the city Code to prevent the demolition of historically-significant buildings through the negligence or inattention of the owner. I am attaching the relevant portions of the Code for you, but the essence of it is that we try to work with the property owner to stabilize the structure for its long-term preservation; if an agreement cannot be reached, then there are fines and penalties that can attach to the property. Let's see what we can do to ensure the continued presence of the Sneed House on this site.
