Chair Lanier called the Commission meeting to order at 6:10 p.m.

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes from the 02/08/2011 meeting were approved on Commissioner Demling motion, Commissioner MacKinnon second, on a 4/0/1/2 vote, with Commissioner Lockler abstaining, and Commissioners Holbrook-White and Schaubert absent.

3. NEW BUSINESS

A. Downtown Austin Plan – Briefing and Possible Action

Mr. Jim Robertson, Manager with Urban Design Division of the Planning and Development Review Department gave a detailed presentation and a general overview of the Downtown Austin Plan, explained some of the recommendations, and provided a brief summary of the major transportation elements of the Plan. Citizen Tom Wald spoke on behalf of the League of Bicycle Voters and read a recommendation prepared by the League that contained some suggestions and requests for changes to the Plan. **No Action Taken.** **B.** Amendment to requirements for Pedicabs and Electric Low Speed Vehicle Services and equipment – Discussion and Possible Action

Mr. Steve Grassfield, Parking Enterprise Manager and Gordon Derr, Assistant Director with the Austin Transportation Department gave a brief presentation about the amendments to requirements for Pedicabs and Electric Low Speed Vehicles Services and equipment staff will be presenting to Council. The Commissioners discussed the two issues at length and heard comments from several citizens, some against and some in favor of the new requirements. Commissioner MacKinnon made a motion to support staff recommendation for both ordinances. Chair Lanier seconded the motion. After discussion and the addition of four friendly amendments to the original motion that included allowing pedicabs to park on non street parking spaces; improve braking test for safety and to avoid jack knifing of the pedicabs; amend the City Code Section 13-2-277 (A) to read "A pedicab driver shall comply with the traffic laws and regulations that apply to motor vehicles *and bicycles*." and, revise the map area to establish boundaries of operation independently for Pedicabs and Electric Low Speed Vehicles (LSV), with LSV's limited to operation in the entertainment district of downtown as a pilot, the motion was approved on a 5/0/2 vote with Commissioners Holbrook-White and Schaubert absent.
