



Public Engagement Plan

City Council's General Fund Priorities

- Limit property tax growth to approximately 6%
 - State law cap is currently 8%
- Modest fee increases (< 5 percent) to offset growth in service costs
 - Maintain development services fees at full cost recovery
- Reduce the portion of the General Fund budget allocated to public safety services




Five-Year General Fund Outlook FY 2019-23

FY19 Budget Recommendations

- Submit recommendations no later than <u>June 8</u>
 - Earlier input increases opportunity for consideration in budget development
- > Recommendations typically provided via a memo to Council or resolution
- Use "bucket not vendor" philosophy
 - Focus recommendations on the desired result, not on specific service providers!

Example of Bucket Approach

Create and execute an outreach strategy for the Human Resources Department to improve diversity of City staff at all levels

Example of Vendor Approach

Provide \$25,000 to ABC Consultants to conduct diversity training to City staff at all levels
