PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1939 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled frame bungalow with a partial-width, front-gabled, independent porch; side-gabled bay approximately halfway down the right side of the house.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1939 by Will and Geneva Perry, who, prior to building this house, lived next door at 1901 E. 16th Street. City directories do not show Will Perry at this address, but Geneva Perry lived here until her death in 1961. The city directories do not list an occupation for Geneva Perry, and she had no occupation shown in the 1940 U.S. Census report either. Her daughter, Edith Elliese McCarthur, is listed as the renter of the house immediately after Geneva's death; the house was then purchased by Dorothy Nunn, a nursing aide at a nursing home, and later at Austin State School. The property is still owned by Dorothy Nunn.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is recommended as contributing to a potential historic district in the East Austin Historic Resources Survey (2016).



Staff has evaluated this house for designation as a historic landmark and has determined that the house does not meet the criteria for landmark designation as set forth in City Code:

- a. **Architecture.** The house is a frame late 1930s bungalow with no architectural distinction.
- b. **Historical association.** The house was owned by a widow for the first 24 years of its existence; there do not appear to be significant historical associations.
- c. **Archaeology.** The house was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
- d. **Community value.** The house does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
- e. **Landscape feature.** The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house does not meet the criteria for individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:**Geneva Perry (ca. 1939 – ca. 1960)**

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Geneva Perry as the owner of this house, which was worth \$1,500. Geneva Perry was a 59-year old widow who had been born in Texas and had no occupation listed. With her lived her daughter, Elliese, 27, a maid; and her son, Vernon, 25, a carpenter in house building. Both Elliese and Vernon were born in Texas.

Geneva Perry died in 1961. Her death certificate shows that she was living in this house at the time of her death. She was born in 1888 in Buda, Texas, and was a domestic.

Funeral services for Mrs. Geneva E. Perry will be held Saturday at 12 noon at the Grant Chapel AME Church with Rev. B. L. McCormick officiating. Burial will be in the Antioch Cemetery at Buda.

Her survivors include her husband, William Perry Sr., one daughter, Mrs. Edith Ellice McCarthen of Austin; one son, William Perry Jr., of Los Angeles; two sisters, Mrs. Clarissa M. Walker of Dallas, Mrs. Annie Scales of Austin; two brothers, Walter A. Kavanaugh of Manchaca, Milton Kavanaugh of Buda; three grandchildren, one great-grandchild.


