

Project History

- June 8, 2006: Council Meeting – Warren Struss, former PARD Director, committed to naming a future disc golf course for retiring Council Member Raul Alvarez
- “Solo Star”, now Little Walnut Creek Greenbelt, property was identified as a potential site of new disc golf course
 - A disc golf course did not materialize at this location
- 2011 – Disc Golf Course was built in the southwest portion of Roy G. Guerrero Colorado River Metro Park
 - Staff is recommending this disc golf course to be named for Council Member Raul Alvarez

Chapter 14-1-37: Park Naming Policy

- A park feature in a park facility may be dedicated to an individual or group to recognize a culturally significant contribution, other valuable contribution, or creditable service to the park system or the community without naming or renaming the park facility in which the feature is located. A plaque recognizing a deserving individual or group may be placed by the park feature without naming or renaming the park facility in which the plaque is placed. Additional plaques recognizing other individuals or groups may be placed at the same feature location. Each plaque may be removed only when the park feature is removed and repurposed into another park feature. Naming a park feature can be done administratively without City Council approval.
