Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide the Austin Fire Department (AFD) with thermal imaging equipment. Thermal imaging cameras are used by firefighters to see through smoke in order to perform effectively, find the source of the fire, and/or locate victims. AFD currently uses an older version of these cameras. These new cameras have an increased battery life, wireless charging, an internal battery, and a five-year warranty.

The intent is to deploy two cameras to each fire truck and rescue unit and one camera to each pumper unit, battalion chief vehicle, and ready reserve pumpers. Extra cameras will be used to replace units in need of repairs. By increasing the number of cameras on the trucks and rescue units, AFD will increase the efficiency of the firefighters' rescue efforts by allowing teams to begin searches of the structure internally and externally at the same time.
