Additional Backup Information:

Set a public hearing to consider an ordinance for the proposed street name change of Manchaca Road to be changed to Menchaca Road. An application was submitted by Council Member Sabino Renteria. The reasons for the street name change as stated on the application are consistent with Code Section 14-5-4.

Property owners within the City of Austin full purpose jurisdiction abutting Manchaca Road will receive notice of a public hearing, a link to background information on the street name change case, and a link to an online comment form where they can express their support or opposition of the street name change and submit comments. A summary of responses will be provided prior to the public hearing.

Initial review by CTM Addressing Services shows that there are approximately 1650 property owners

abutting Manchaca Road within the City of Austin full purpose jurisdiction. Through conversations with representatives from Travis County and Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), staff has determined that the portions of Manchaca Road located outside of City of Austin would retain their TxDOT numbered highway name (FM 2304).

Concur review forms will be sent to seven agencies to ensure the street name change would not pose conflict with services: Austin Fire Department, Austin Police Department, Austin Transportation Department, Emergency Medical Services, Texas Gas Service, Travis County, and United States Postal Service.

Staff has determined this request to be consistent with the City's Codes and Policies and recommends the setting of a public hearing.
