HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION SEPTEMBER 24, 2018 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2018-0384 3308 Hampton Road

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1937 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled building built in the Colonial Revival style. The building is clad in wood siding and has a full-width porch. Fenestration includes double-hung wood-sash windows and a wood door.

RESEARCH

The building was constructed as 3300 Hampton Road around 1937. H. M. Taylor Jr. and Agnes S. Taylor were the first residents. Initially recorded as renting the property in city directories, they owned it by 1939 and lived there until early 1946. H. M. Taylor worked as an engineer and bridge draftsman for the State Highway Department before joining the Army by 1944-45. Robert R. Buecher owned the property for a short period from about 1947 until about 1949, after which the house appears to have been incorporated into the Robert E. Lee School at 3308 Hampton Road, with no occupants listed in city directories. From 1973 until at least 1977, the building was used as the Austin Preschool Hearing Center.

STAFF COMMENTS

The building may meet one criterion for designation as a historic landmark, but it does not appear to meet the designation threshold of two criteria.

Designation Criteria—Historic Landmark

- 1) The building is 50 years old, having been constructed around 1937.
- 2) The building retains a high degree of integrity.
- 3) Properties must meet two historic designation criteria for landmark designation (City of Austin Land Development Code, Section 25-2-352). The property appears to demonstrate significance according to one criterion.
 - a. **Architecture.** The house is built in the Colonial Revival style and may qualify for landmark designation under this criteria, as it embodies the distinguishing characteristics of the Colonial Revival style as adapted for a modest single-family house.
 - b. **Historical association**. The building does not appear to have significant historical associations that contributed significantly to the history of the city, state, or nation; or represent a significant portrayal of the cultural practices or way of life of a definable group of people in a historic time.
 - c. Archaeology. The property was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
 - d. **Community value**. The property does not appear to have a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, a neighborhood, or a particular group.

e. Landscape feature. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive reuse of the building. If the Commission votes to release the permit, then staff recommends relocation over demolition, and completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.



Background Research


Henry M. Taylor Jr. was born in 1901 in Texas. By 1930, he was living in Austin and worked for the State Highway Department, where he worked as a civil engineer until the

early 1940s. He joined the Army by 1944-45. His date of death was not located during research.

Agnes S. Taylor was born about 1899 in Texas. She married H. M. Taylor Jr. between 1932 and 1937; by 1940, she was working as a stenographer for the State Treasurer. Her date of date was not located during research.



"Open House" advertisement, The Austin American, 3/17/1946.





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




1935 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map. The house at 3300 Hampton Road had not yet been constructed.
