Hey Steve-

I've attached a flier that explains a bit more about the project. Lamberts (401 W 2nd St, Austin, TX 78701) has agreed to host us for this project. The images will be attached using a water-soluble wheat paste. It is non-toxic and non-corrosive and will not damage walls or paint.

I hope we can work together for this project! We worked with [Inside Out in Dallas](#) and the event went great and registered roughly 200 hundred voters over the course of the four days the event was held.

It's up to you/Lamberts how long you want it to be left up. The images are printed on butcher paper so they deteriorate with the elements. They can also be removed using a power washer.
