






Rapid Population Growth and a Declining Share of Regional Growth

City of Austin Population Growth 1870 to 2018




Austin Metro Population Share 1990 to 2017











Austin Age Structure by Race and Ethnicity



Year over Year Percent Change in Job Growth






Worker Flows for Austin 2014












Median Family Income









Change in Economically Disadvantaged Student Population 2005 - 2015



2040 projected total jobs: 976,887




US Constitution requires that each decade we take a count – or census – of America's population.

- performed every decade since 1790
- responsible for the reapportionment of Congressional districts among the states and redistricting
- tied to the re-allocation of over \$675
 billion annually in federal funds
