WHEREAS, RISE Residential Construction, L.P. (hereafter, "Applicant"), its successors, assigns or affiliates, proposes to construct an affordable rental housing development of approximately 280 units to be located near the intersection of Bellingham and East Parmer Lane, in the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction (hereafter, "Development"); and

WHEREAS, Applicant, its successors, assigns or affiliates, has advised that it intends to submit an application to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) for 4% Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) for the Development to be known as Austin Parmer II Apartment Homes; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

In accordance with Section 2306.67071 of the Texas Government Code, the City Council finds:

- 1. the Applicant provided notice to the City Council as required by Subsection (a); and
- 2. the City Council had sufficient opportunity to obtain a response from the Applicant regarding any questions or concerns about the proposed Development; and
- 3. the City Council held a hearing at which public comment could be made on the proposed Development in accordance with Subsection (b); and
- 4. after due consideration of the information provided by the Applicant and public

comment, the City Council does not object to the Applicant's proposed application to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs related to the Development.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

Pursuant to Section 2306.6703(a)(4) of the Texas Government Code and Sections 11.3 and 11.4 of Texas' Qualified Allocation Plan, the City Council supports the proposed Development; approves the construction of the proposed Development; and authorizes an allocation of LIHTC for the proposed Development.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

Pursuant to Sections 11.3 and 11.4 of Texas' Qualified Allocation Plan, the City Council acknowledges that the proposed Development is located one linear mile or less from a development that serves the same type of household as the proposed Development and has received an allocation of Housing Tax Credits (or Private Activity Bonds) for new construction within the three year period preceding the date the Certificate of Reservation is issued.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

Pursuant to Section 11.3 of Texas' Qualified Allocation Plan, the City Council expressly acknowledges and confirms that the City has more than twice the state average of units per capita supported by Housing Tax Credits or Private Activity Bonds.
