(Note: This solicitation was reviewed for subcontracting opportunities in accordance with City Code Chapter 2-9D Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program. For the goods and services required for this solicitation, there were no available M/WBEs; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established).

Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide a replacement electrcodeionization assembly for Sand Hill Energy Center. Services include the removal and disposal of the existing electrodeionization system and the design and installation of a complete new electrodeionization assembly. This critical assembly purifies water that is necessary to generate power. In the event of a failure, Austin Energy must locate a backup assembly which can be costly and availability is not guaranteed. The current assembly, commissioned in 2004 is no longer supported by the manufacturer and has become less reliable.

An evaluation team with expertise in this area evaluated the offer and recommended Suez Treatment Solutions Inc.to provide these services based on schedule, experience and qualifications, technical solution and program, cost, local business presence, and Service-Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise
