Community Services Block Grant Programmatic/Financial Report November 13, 2018

The Community Services Block Grant funds the delivery of services to low income Texas residents in all 254 counties. These funds support a variety of direct services in addition to helping maintain the core administrative elements of community action agencies.

For the City of Austin, the grant provides funding for the delivery of basic needs, case management, preventive health and employment support services through the City's six (6) Neighborhood Centers and the three (3) Outreach Sites.

- Basic Needs (food, clothing, information and referral, notary services, transportation, school supplies, car safety education and car seats, tax preparation, Blue Santa applications, fans, Thanksgiving food baskets and other seasonal activities);
- Preventive Health (screenings for blood pressure, blood sugar, and cholesterol; pregnancy testing; health promotion presentations, coordination and participation in health fairs, immunizations, coordination of wellness activities, linkages to medical home providers);
- Case Management (individual/family support counseling, advocacy, self-sufficiency case management, crisis intervention, linkages with employers, educational opportunities and training, and working with individuals on quality of life issues);
- Employment Support (intake, assessment and goal setting, job readiness training, job placement assistance, and job retention services)

- 1. <u>2019 CSBG Budget</u> –The final FY2019 CSBG funding level is \$724 million which is a \$10 million dollar increase above the FY2018 level. City of Austin will remain at level funding from its final 2018 allocation at \$1,102,106.
- <u>TDHCA Monitoring Visit</u> The final results of the monitoring visit are included in the documents. The initial finding was resolved and the final closeout document was received.
- <u>City of Austin FY17 Single Audit</u> Audit was completed and there were no findings for CSBG.
- 4. <u>Austin Energy Plus1</u> Austin Public Health was awarded funding to provide utility assistance to clients. The funding is now available and we will begin approving vouchers once staff have been trained.
- 5. <u>Neighborhood Services Manager –</u> Hiring for the position is currently underway and the goal is to have the position filled permanently as soon as possible.
- 6. <u>Great Christmas Tree Event</u> The Omni Hotel will be sponsoring the 18th Annual Great Christmas Tree Event at the downtown location, December 6th, 10a-12p. The hotel provides pre-lit trees to 10 elementary schools that decorate the trees in the hotel. The trees are then donated to Neighborhood Services to give to eligible families. There will be over 500 children in attendance and entertainment will be provided by the Ortega School Band.
