

RESOLUTION NO. 20181120-001

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2018, a general municipal election was held for the purpose of election a Mayor (at-large) and City Council Members (single member districts) for District 1, District 3, District 5, District 8, and District 9; and on the same date special elections were held to present to the voters seven proposed bond propositions, two proposed amendments to the City Charter, and two proposed ordinances; voters were given the option of voting “for” or “against” on all measures; and

50 Madison and Mariana Salazar, neither candidate received a majority of all votes cast
51 for City Council Member District 1; and

52 **WHEREAS**, of the two candidates who received the highest number of votes
53 cast for the office of City Council Member District 3, those being Susana Almanza
54 and Sabino “Pio” Renteria, neither candidate received a majority of all votes cast for
55 City Council Member District 3; and

56 **WHEREAS**, Ann Kitchen received a majority of all votes cast for the office
57 of City Council Member District 5; and

58 **WHEREAS**, of the two candidates who received the highest number of votes
59 cast for the office of City Council Member District 8, those being Frank Ward and
60 Paige Ellis, neither candidate received a majority of all votes cast for City Council
61 Member District 8; and

62 **WHEREAS**, Kathryne “Kathie” Tovo received a majority of all votes cast
63 for the office of City Council Member District 9; and

64 **WHEREAS**, the returns of the special election have been made to the Council
65 and show that the votes for and against the propositions were cast as follows:

99 **WHEREAS**, a majority of all votes cast in the special election were cast for
100 Proposition Nos. A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, and I, and a majority of all votes cast in the
101 special election were cast against Proposition Nos. J and K; **NOW, THEREFORE,**
102 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

103 The Council finds that all of the recitals contained in this resolution are true
104 and adopts them as findings of fact by this governing body; and

105 The Council finds that the results of the general election as tabulated, received,
106 and canvassed reflect the votes cast at the election; and

107 The Council accepts and approves the returns for the general election, as
108 tabulated, received, and canvassed, and declares that the following persons are
109 declared elected and may qualify for the office indicated for terms that begin January
110 6, 2019:

111 Mayor Steve Adler

112 City Council Member District 5 Ann Kitchen

113 City Council Member District 9 Kathie Tovo; and

114 In order to elect a City Council Member for District 1, City Council Member
115 for District 3, and a City Council Member for District 8, the City Council shall order
116 a runoff election as soon as is practicable and no later than the fifth day after this
117 canvass as required by state law (TEX. ELEC. CODE § 2.024).

118 The Council finds that the results of the special elections as tabulated,
119 received, and canvassed reflect the votes cast at the election; and

120 The Council accepts and approves the returns for the special elections, as
121 tabulated, received, and canvassed, and declares that Proposition Nos. A, B, C, D,
122 E, F, G, H, and I are adopted.

123 With this canvass, Council is making official the precinct returns received
124 from the counties.
