3. APPROVAL OF SEPTEMBER 2018 MEETING MINUTES

4. UPDATE ON FATALITIES IN AUSTIN CAUSED BY TRAFFIC CRASHES

Alicia Santiago read aloud the names of the five people killed in traffic crashes on Austin streets since the BAC last met: Andrew Sanchez, Luis Angel Tinoco, Michael Duron Green, Jonathan Deleon, and an unidentified hispanic male.

6. ITEMS FROM BAC

A. Recommendation regarding proposed Final Rule governing dockless mobility services in the City of Austin – Discussion and Possible Action

Raquel Ortega presented draft recommendation language to the BAC which, after debate and amendment, read as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Bicycle Advisory Council recommends that the following edits be incorporated into the final regulations for dockless mobility units:

- 1. Definitions No edits suggested
- 2. Dockless Mobility Units
 - Replace "shall" with "must" in order to denote a condition precedent which means that the parties are required to comply with the terms of licensure.
 - o Simplify Section C to read as follows
 - i. Dockless Mobility Units must be equipped with a brake.
 - ii. All dockless mobility units must be equipped with lighting as there are no units that are restricted to day use only. Lighting requirements include:
 - 1. A lamp on the front of the unit that emits a white light visible from a distance of a least 500 feet in front of the unit.
 - 2. A lamp on the rear of the unit that emits a red light visible from 500 feet to the rear of the unit.
 - 3. Lights must remain on at all times the unit is in use as well as for 90 seconds after the unit has stopped moving.
- 3. Service Area and Size of Fleet
 - \circ Add to 3(i) 5. Use of safer unit types as evidenced in section 7 (H)
- 4. Safety
 - Replace "shall" with "must" in order to denote a condition precedent which means that the parties are required to comply with the terms of licensure.
 - o Revise Section H to read as follows
 - i. Licensees agree to educate users on lawful and safe use of the dockless mobility units including encouraging users to obey traffic control devices and ride with the flow of traffic.
- 5. Parking no edits suggested
- 6. Operations and Customer Service
 - Add Section H to cite the section of City Code that governs sidewalk riding.
 - o Revise C.1. Pedestrians First People operating dockless mobility units must yield to people walking.
- 7. Privacy, Data Reporting, and Sharing–No edits suggested
- 8. Insurance, Performance, Bond, and Fees
 - Add Section F to read as follows
 - i. Licensees shall be assessed an additional, ongoing per-unit fee to be held in a dedicated fund and utilized for new and improved bike lanes and to create single racks and corrals to accommodate

increased demand for parking spaces by dockless mobility units. Racks and corrals must follow the City of Austin Active Transportation Division's rack and corral design criteria. The requirement for use of high security fasteners is mandated.

9. General – No edits suggested

A motion to approve the <u>recommendation</u> was adopted on Lentz motion, Alcorn second on a 9-0 vote. Staff will share the recommendation with the appropriate Austin Transportation Department staff.

B. Recommendation regarding railroad crossings - Discussion and Possible Action

Tommy Eden presented draft recommendation language to the BAC which, after debate and amendment, read as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Bicycle Advisory Council recommends the allocation of funds necessary to redesign and reconstruct railroad crossings, allowing bicyclists and wheelchair users to cross the tracks at a safe angle without entering motor vehicle lanes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bicycle Advisory Council recommends that the specific locations of hazardous railroad crossings to be considered for improvements include, but not be limited to, the railroad crossings on Vinson Dr/Emerald Forest near St. Elmo, on W. Mary St. near Evergreen, on Rosewood Ave. near the Pleasant Valley underpass, and on the northbound and southbound MoPac frontage road between Gracy Farms Ln. and Park Bend Rd. at the Red Line.

A motion to approve the <u>recommendation</u> was adopted on Flowers motion, Santiago second on a 9-0 vote. Staff will share the recommendation with the appropriate Union Pacific and City of Austin staff.
