#### 1. Introductions

#### 2. Public Communication: General

Glenn Meter shared comments in support of a new, nearly-complete bicycle and pedestrian underpass at US 183 near Shoal Creek Blvd and concerns regarding the safety of the bike lanes along Pedernales and the public process for the on the Shoal Creek Conservancy's Shoal Creek Trail Plan.

# 5. Bicyclist Considerations Mobility Guideline Update

A <u>presentation</u> regarding the <u>draft guideline</u> was given by Ryan Mooney, Transportation Supervisor with ATD's Right of Way Management, and Carly Haithcock, Contractor with ATD's Active Transportation and Street Design Division.

## 6. Austin Strategic Mobility Plan (ASMP) Update

A <u>presentation</u> was given by Annick Beaudet, ATD Assistant Director. Tristian Heinen volunteered to lead a subcommittee to develop draft recommendations regarding the ASMP draft policies and maps.

### 7. Recommendation regarding bicycle parking

Raquel Ortega submitted draft recommendation language to the BAC prior to the meeting which, after debate and amendment, read as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Bicycle Advisory Council recommends that the following bicycle parking provisions be added to the current version and be included in future revisions of Austin's land development code (currently codified under City of Austin Title 25 Land Development Code, Chapter 6 Transportation) as it relates to all commercial and multi-family developments:

- Apply the following equation in order to determine the required minimum number of bicycle parking spaces:
  - Percentage Ridership Goal x Maximum Occupancy Number of Building = Required Minimum Bicycle
     Parking Spaces
    - Percentage Ridership Goal should be determined as follows:
      - For Austin central city area utilize the Austin Bicycle Plan ridership goal of 15%
      - For citywide development excluding the Austin central city area utilize the Austin Bicycle Plan ridership goal of 5%
- Allow commercial and multi-family residential entities to apply for a reduction in auto parking minimums in
  exchange for high capacity bike corrals with one auto parking spot being replaced by a high capacity corral that
  can hold a minimum of 8 bicycle parking spaces. Each replaced spot must be the closest available spot to the
  primary entrance excluding the ADA spots. Allow option to remove any and all auto parking spaces, except those
  spaces for people with disabilities.
- Require that all entities installing single racks and corrals follow The City of Austin Active Transportation
   Division's rack and corral design criteria. The requirement for use of high security fasteners to the ground should be mandated.

A motion to approve the <u>recommendation</u> was adopted on Heinen motion, LeBlanc second on an 8-0 vote with Ortega absent. Staff will publish the recommendation on the BAC's <u>webpage</u> and share the recommendation with the appropriate City of Austin staff.
