CAMPO & CTRMA Projects The Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) is the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for Bastrop, Burnet, Caldwell, Hays, Travis, and Williamson Counties. MPOs are federally required throughout the country in areas with a population of 50,000 or more and are required to produce a 20+ year transportation plan, called a Regional Transportation Plan (RTP), and a four-year planning document called the Transportation Improvement Program. The Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority is an independent government agency created in 2002 to improve the transportation system in Williamson and Travis counties. Governs toll roads (183A, 71, 290, MoPac Express)	Travis County Projects Transportation and Natural Resources (TNR) provides engineering, design, construction, and maintenance of county roads, drainage and bridges. Within County, but outside City limits most often.	ASMP The Austin Strategic Mobility Plan (ASMP) is Austin's new city-wide transportation plan. They are developing this plan to make it easier to get around Austin for years to come.
