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# WHY DEVELOP A CONSOLIDATED PLAN?

## WHAT IS A CONSOLIDATED PLAN?

A Consolidated Plan is designed to help local jurisdictions assess affordable housing and community development needs and market conditions. It serves as the framework for identifying housing and community development needs.

Without it, the City would not be eligible for federal funding from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).




