8	PART 1. AUTHORITY.					
9 10 11 12	The Council adopts these local standards of care for the Parks and Recreation Department's youth recreational programs pursuant to Texas Human Resources Code Section 42.041(b)(14) ( <i>Required License and Accreditation</i> ) and its home rule authority.					
L3	PART 2. DEFINITIONS.					
L4	In this ordinance:					
15 16 17 18	(1)	ACTIVITY LEADER means a person responsible for the direct care or supervision of participants. The term excludes a person whose primary duties include administration, clerical support, food preparation, or facility maintenance.				
19	(2)	DEPARTMENT means the Parks and Recreation Department.				
20	(3)	DIRECTOR means the director of the Parks and Recreation Department.				
21 22	(4)	DESIGNEE means a person appointed by the director to act on the director's behalf.				
23 24	(5)	FACILITY means a building or improvement operated or used by the department in conducting a recreational program.				
25 26 27	(6)	PARTICIPANT means a child age five to 13 years old who is enrolled in a recreational program and is under the supervision of department staff.				

(7) RECREATIONAL PROGRAM or PROGRAM means a fee-based 28 children's program or activity offered and supervised by the department 29 that requires a participant to enroll or register to participate. 30 (8) VOLUNTEER means a person assisting without remuneration in the 31 care or supervision of participants. 32 PART 3. PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION. 33 The department shall operate recreational programs in compliance with 34 appropriate state law, this ordinance, and the department's rules adopted 35 by this ordinance. 36 The director, or designee, shall administer the programs. (B) 37 PART 4. PROGRAM RULES; MONITORING. 38 The director shall adopt rules relating to the operation of the programs. (A) 39 A rule adopted under this ordinance may be more restrictive than the 40 minimum standards adopted by this ordinance. 41 (B) The director shall monitor the programs to ensure compliance with the 42 standards adopted by this ordinance and the rules. 43 PART 5. REQUIRED SUPERVISION FOR NON-AQUATIC 44 RECREATIONAL PROGRAMS. 45 Except as provided in Subsection (B) and Part 6 (Required Supervision 46 for Aquatic Recreational Programs), the department shall provide 47 activity leaders during a recreational program at a minimum as follows: 48 (1) one activity leader for each 12 participants five to nine years old; 49 and 50 (2) one activity leader for each 15 participants ten to 13 years old. 51 (B) The department shall provide activity leaders during a recreational 52 program designed for participants with a disability at a minimum as 53 follows: 54

55 56		(1) one activity leader for each four participants five to 12 years old; and
57		(2) one activity leader for each eight participants 12 to 13 years old.
58 59	PART 6. I	REQUIRED SUPERVISION FOR AQUATIC RECREATIONAL MS.
60 61 62	(A)	Except as provided in Subsection (C), the department shall provide activity leaders during a recreational program that includes swimming in a swimming pool at a minimum as follows:
63 64		(1) one activity leader for each eight participants five to seven years old; and
65		(2) one activity leader for each 12 participants eight to 13 years old.
66 67 68	(B)	Except as provided in Subsection (C), the department shall provide activity leaders during a recreational program that includes swimming in a wading pool at a minimum as follows:
69 70		(1) one activity leader for each five participants of five years of age; and
71		(2) one activity leader for each 12 participants six to 13 years old.
72 73 74 75	(C)	During a recreational program designed for participants with a disability that includes swimming in a swimming pool or wading pool, the department shall provide one activity leader for each eight participants five to 13 years old.
76 77 78	(D)	The department may not conduct a recreational program at a swimming pool or wading pool outside a City park unless the use of the pool has been approved by the director.
79	<b>PART 7.</b> 1	REQUIREMENTS FOR ACTIVITY LEADERS.
80 81	(A)	The department shall provide a minimum of one activity leader for each class or group enrolled in a recreational program.

An activity leader must be at least: (B) 82 (1) 18 years old; or 83 (2) 15 years old if supervised by another activity leader who is at least 84 18 years old. 85 (C) An activity leader must retain the following certification from a 86 nationally recognized organization approved by the director: 87 basic water rescue, or equivalent, as approved by the director, if (1) 88 supervising a recreational program that includes swimming; 89 (2) cardiopulmonary resuscitation for adults, children, and infants; 90 use of an automated external defibrillator; and 91 (3) (4) first aid. 92 PART 8. STAFF AND VOLUNTEER TRAINING REQUIREMENTS. 93 (A) The director shall establish training requirements for all staff and 94 volunteers who provide direct care or supervision to participants. 95 (B) At least one staff member at each facility must have current training in 96 first aid, automated external defibrillator, and cardiopulmonary 97 resuscitation for adults, children, and infants from a nationally 98 recognized program that has been approved by the director. 99 (C) Each staff member who supervises children in swimming or other water 100 activities shall be trained in basic water rescue, or equivalent, as 101 approved by the director. A person who is not counted in the minimum 102 staff-to-participant ratio is not required to meet these requirements. 103 PART 9. PERSONNEL RESTRICTION. 104 (A) A person may not be employed or serve as a volunteer in a recreational 105 program if: 106

107 108 109		(1)	the person would be permanently barred from being present at a child care operation while children are in care under Texas Administrative Code Title 40, Part 19, Chapter 745 ( <i>Licensing</i> ); or
110 111 112		(2)	the director determines that, based on the criminal history and other relevant and credible information, the person poses a risk to the safety or health of participants.
113 114	(B)		director may obtain a criminal history record of any employee or nteer working or applying to work in a recreational program.
115	PART 10.	FAC	CILITY OPERATION; PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT.
116 117	(A)		department may not operate a recreational program at a facility ss the facility meets the following requirements:
118 119		(1)	The facility and equipment used in the program do not present fire, health, or safety hazards and are kept free of refuse and debris.
120		(2)	The facility is inspected annually for safety by the department.
121		(3)	The facility is kept free of insects, rodents, and stray animals.
122		(4)	The facility has clearly marked emergency exits.
123 124		(5)	The facility has a disaster and evacuation procedure posted in a visible location.
125 126 127 128		(6)	The facility is used and maintained in accordance with the fire prevention requirements of City Code Chapter 25-12 ( <i>Technical Codes</i> ) and the fire chief's directives, including not fewer than four fire drills each year.
129 130 131		(7)	First aid and infection control kits are kept at the facility, including sufficient additional kits to be taken to other locations at which participants engage in a program activity.
132 133		(8)	First aid guidelines are on file and visibly posted at the facility, including:

cardiopulmonary resuscitation and rescue breathing (a) 134 sequence guidelines; 135 first aid review; and 136 (b) (c) emergency action plans. 137 (9)The facility has a sufficient number of restrooms that are equipped 138 for independent use by children and that are designed to permit 139 staff supervision if necessary. 140 The department shall maintain a campground or primitive facility used (B) 141 for a recreation program in compliance with the requirements of 142 Subsection (A) to the extent possible. 143 (C) The department shall maintain equipment used in the programs in good 144 condition. Department staff shall remove a defective tool, machinery, 145 appliance, or other equipment and report the defective item to a 146 supervisor. Unauthorized staff may not repair defective equipment. 147 PART 11. PHYSICAL HEALTH STANDARDS. 148 (A) A staff member shall supervise a participant who is ill or injured until a 149 parent or other authorized adult removes the participant from the 150 facility. 151 Staff shall keep a participant whose illness or medical condition would (B) 152 compromise the health or safety of the others separate from the others 153 until the child is removed from the facility. 154 Staff shall call a participant's parent or guardian if participant has an 155 (C) oral temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or greater, accompanied 156 by behavioral changes or other signs or symptoms of illness. 157 Staff may not admit or readmit a participant whose illness or medical (D) 158 condition prevents the participant from comfortably participating in 159 program activities or in places where other participants may be put at 160 risk for the duration of the illness or condition. 161

In the case of an acute illness or injury to a participant, staff shall call (E) 162 for an emergency vehicle to transport the participant to an authorized 163 medical facility. 164 PART 12. MEDICATION STANDARDS. 165 (A) A staff member may not administer medication to a participant without 166 a parental medication authorization. Staff may not administer 167 medication that is not in its original container or past the expiration date 168 on the container. 169 A staff member may not administer an injection or an amount of 170 medication that is inconsistent with the prescribed dosage. A staff 171 member may administer an epinephrine auto-injector device if the staff 172 member has completed training approved by the department. 173 (C) A staff member may not accept more than a one-week supply of 174 medication for a participant, and the staff member shall return the 175 unused medication to the parent on the last program day of the week. 176 (D) Staff must keep medication in a secured location that is not accessible 177 by participants. 178 A staff member shall maintain a medication log that includes the name 179 (E) of the child to whom the medication is administered, the time the 180 medication is dispensed, and the name of the person dispensing the 181 medication. 182 183 PART 13. DISTRIBUTION OF STANDARDS. 184 The department shall post and make available copies of the standards (A) 185 adopted in this ordinance or by rules adopted under this ordinance. 186 The department shall inform parents or guardians of each participant that 187 (B) the recreational programs are not licensed by the state. The programs 188 may not be advertised as child-care facilities. 189 190
