


\*HB 3566, filed by Rep. Farrar, would allow for exam reimbursement from the Crime Victims' Compensation fund for healthcare facilities providing strangulation assessment.

- Survivor options available at the Forensic Nursing and Advocacy Program:
  - Medical care: STI and pregnancy prevention, physical exam as requested
  - Law enforcement report: Education, assistance, and facilitation of a report to law enforcement
  - Evidence collection:
    - With law enforcement report: Kit goes to law enforcement agency involved.
    - Without law enforcement report ("non-report"): Kit goes into storage for two years but there is no testing, no toxicology is collected. Available only to adults who are not mandatory reports.
  - Support, resources, and advocacy: Referrals for counseling, medical, civil legal services, shelter or housing, etc.
  - Participation in the University of North Carolina research study on how people recover after a sexual assault
  - None of the above: Survivors may decide not to pursue any of these options because of time constraints, privacy concerns, personal choice, etc.
- We see 0-3 survivors per month decide to convert a non-report kit to a law enforcement report before
  the kit is sent off to the Texas Department of Public Safety for storage
  - Law enforcement agencies will have better data about conversions overall, because conversions often happen after the patient leaves our care and the kit leaves our possession
- We monitor the rate of non-report exams as an indication that we are offering robust informed consent and are respecting survivors' autonomy
