PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1928 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, roughly rectangular-plan, front-gabled frame house with a full-width, shed-roofed porch on plain square wood posts; non-historic fenestration.

RESEARCH

Utility permits to T.E. Odiorne, a local businessman and builder, were issued for this address in 1925, but the address does not appear in city directories until after 1927, indicating a more likely construction date of around 1928. The house was a rental property from the time of its construction until around 1948; the longest-term tenants were John A. and Maude Shropshire, who lived here from around 1936 to around 1946. John A. Shropshire was a painter; Maude Shropshire was a dressmaker. All of the Shropshires' sons also went into the painting business.

The house was purchased by John and Irmtraud Helgren around 1946, when John Helgren was a student at the University of Texas. Irmtraud Helgren was a recent immigrant from Frankfurt, Germany who worked at Yaring's, a ladies' department store on Congress Avenue. John Helgren became a book-keeper for Calcasieu Lumber Company; they moved from this house around 1953.

The house was a rental property again the mid-1950s, then purchased by Edward and Lucy Rangel, who lived here until around 1964. Edward Rangel was a paint mixer for a local paint company. A retired couple purchased the house in the early 1970s and lived here for several years before renting it out to Raymond Samilpa, Jr., an employee of Economy Furniture, who lived here until the early 1980s.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any city survey to date.


Staff has evaluated this house for designation as a historic landmark and has determined that the house does not meet the criteria for landmark designation as set forth in City Code:

- a. **Architecture.** The house is a very simple front-gabled house that has been significantly modified over the years with new windows and what appears to be a side addition probably constructed in 1953. Because of its loss of integrity, the house does not qualify under the criterion of architecture for landmark designation.
- b. **Historical association**. The house was a rental property for most of its existence, with a series of renters and owners who lived here for short periods of time. The longest-term renters were a painting contractor and his family, who lived here in the from the mid-1930s through the mid-1940s. There do not appear to be any significant historical associations.
- c. **Archaeology**. The house was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
- d. **Community value**. The house does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image,

- or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
- e. Landscape feature. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house does not meet the criteria for individual designation as a historic landmark.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Worthie and Gertrude McLemore as the renters of this house. Worthie McLemore was 26, had been born in Texas, and was a helper in the Sanitary Department. Gertrude McLemore was 20, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had no children listed with them.

John and Maude Shropshire (ca. 1936 - ca. 1946)

The 1930 U.S. Census shows J.A. and Maud Shropshire living on Austin Route 5 in Travis County. J.A. Shropshire was 54, had been born in Georgia, and was a painter in a shop. Maud Shropshire was 49, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had 5 children, all born in Texas: Ted, 29, a painter in a shop; Louis, 27, a painter for a building company; Cecil, 21, a painter for a building company; Jack, 18, a painter for a building company; and Carolyn, 14.

John A. Shropshire's 1965 death certificate shows that his last address was 2908 South Congress Avenue. He was born in 1874 in Georgia, and was a painting contractor. He was a widower.


John and Irmtraud Helgren (ca. 1948 – ca. 1953)

He was the 3rd of Wesley and Dora Helgren's 5 children listed. Wesley Helgren was a Texas-born farmer who rented his farm.

His 1942 World War II draft card shows that John Edward Helgren was born in Manor, Texas, and was living in Manor at that time. He was 6 feet tall, weighed 45 pounds, and had a ruddy complexion with brown hair and hazel eyes. He was unemployed.

Raymond Samilpa, Jr. (ca. 1975 - ca. 1984)

Raymond Samilpa, Jr. was born in Travis County in 1952. He married Gracie A. Garza in 1972; they divorced in April, 1983.
