Hi Cara,

Thanks for checking in - happy to answer any questions:

- 1. Yes, the trellis shown is 6' deep. You're right that in the front perspective, it doesn't really look deeper than the front porch overhang though I think that's a factor of the rendering / shadowing...but yes, it will extend 6' in front of the garage. This shows up a little better on the side/approach view (p.11) and the floor plans (p.14)...
- 2. Windows will be a combination of fixed and casement.
- 3. Aluminum-frame windows, in a dark bronze finish.

A quick update on the neighborhood perspective - we met with OWANA's Zoning Committee today and they let us know that they do not oppose the design, including the garage orientation & placement. We have a note of support from the owner of the adjacent property (the Castle) - I've attached that here, in case it's helpful.
