- (1) Review Board Members' meetings with City and County Officials.
 - (a) Lorig Hawkins reached out to County Commissioner Travillion
 - (b) Joi Chevalier met with Judge Eckhardt, not around a specific ask but more generally
- iii) Board Recommendations Follow-up
 - (1) Use of City and County-owned Land for Urban Agriculture
 - (a) Edwin Marty provided City update. Last month had call with Texas peer cities around how to use flood plain property for urban agriculture.
 - (b) Emily Ackland provided County update. Walnut Creek site adjacent to state jail is currently being primed for land lease for agriculture (location: 8101 FM 969, Austin, TX 78724). Soil testing underway. RFP process pending.
 - (c) City has list of potential properties for urban agriculture. Similar list does not necessarily exist at County.
 - (d) WG to consider making recommendation that Economic Development Department at County work with Emily Ackland to assess opportunities.

6) NEW BUSINESS

- i) Debrief of the Joint Sustainability Committee meeting—Karen Magid provided updates on April meeting. Budget recommendations that were due May 3rd. Committee passed several recommendations.
 - (1) Allocate funding between Equity and Sustainability Office
 - (2) Prioritize funding for full compliance of City regulations (i.e., Universal Recycling Ordinance compliance)
 - (3) Funding and formalizing liaisons with Office of Sustainability
 - (4) PARD to receive funding for pilot projects to address climate goals
 - (5) Created a new working group focused on Community Engagement
- ii) Discuss Food Policy Board's engagement with other Boards and Commissions Andrea Abel to attend meeting next Joint Inclusion Committee on May 22nd.
- iii) Discuss Strategic Planning Session in August using June meeting to plan for August Strategic Planning. No meeting in July.
- iv) Working Group Briefings and Recommendations
 - (1) Build Opportunities for Food Entrepreneur -- Sharon Mays was absent. Amanda Rohlich provided update. Connected with Service Design Lab to take on Food Pantry Permitting to help lead through process. Next meeting will be a review of research. Deliverables expected by August.
 - (2) Food and Climate Karen Magid provided updates. Working on addendum to on Food and Climate to Austin Community Climate Plan. Plans to roll in to Climate Plan update. Presenting to Restore Rundberg group on May 26th. Planning focus groups around how people are choosing what they are eating and how that ties back to climate and food access. Questions are currently being developed. Creating one-pager to discuss connections between food and climate and how to link food access and climate friendly diets. Update from Emily Ackland County interested in developed Climate Action Plan. Update from Edwin Marty on EAT Lancet policy brief.
 - (3) Healthy Food Access to All Communities Andrea Abel provided updates. Last meeting had legislative updates from Judith McGeary from Food and Ranch Freedom Alliance. Working with Anneliese Lottman to do visioning process to prepare for making recommendations in early Fall. Community garden recommendations to come to board in June.

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- (4) Support Farms & Farmers Thomas Schroeder provided updates. Recommendation for consideration of city and county land for urban agriculture.
 - (a) Update from Felipe Camacho on Del Valle ISD Citizens Bond Advisory Committee
 - (b) Lorig Hawkins motioned to discuss the recommendation with Andrea Abel seconding the motion
 - (i) Why parcels of USDA designated farm land. Based on their soil maps. In the Be It Resolved section, change language to include "designated *prime* farmland"
 - (ii) Limit to commercial or open to ag in general? Strike "commercial" so as to allow for non-profit and other ag uses.
 - (iii) Change Austin Travis County Food Policy Board recommends that agricultural production be considered as a best use of public acquired land on property with a USDA prime farmland designation.
 - (iv) Third Whereas, change lose to loses
 - (v) Lorig motioned, Joi seconded
