2	WHEREAS, Resolution No. 20040212-035 initiated the Rainey Street area
3	rezoning and the regulations review for the Rainey Street Subdistrict of the
4	Waterfront Overlay Combining District; and
5	WHEREAS, subsequent to the rezonings, the Rainey Street area has been
6	the site of tremendous residential and commercial growth and redevelopment; and
7	WHEREAS, Rainey Street area residents and business owners have
8	repeatedly requested that the City develop a master plan to identify strategies for
9	managing mobility challenges for the thousands of current Rainey residents and the
10	several thousand more on the way; and
11	WHEREAS, the Austin Strategic Mobility Plan (ASMP), adopted on April
12	11, 2019, references the need to improve mobility in the Rainey Street
13	neighborhood; and
14	WHEREAS, the Austin Transportation Department (ATD) is proposing a
15	local mobility plan for the Rainey Street neighborhood as part of the Austin Core
16	Transportation Plan; and
17	WHEREAS, the Rainey Neighborhood Mobility Study and Plan prepared
18	by Big Red Dog in May 2017 provided comprehensive recommendations for
19	mobility improvements in the Rainey area; and
20	WHEREAS, the pedestrian volume data collected by Big Red Dog at the
21	intersection of Rainey and River Street counted more than 1,500 pedestrians on a
22	single Saturday between the hours of 9:30 p.m. and 2:30 a.m.; and

23	WHEREAS , on June 10, th a pedestrian was struck by a vehicle on Rainey
24	Street and sustained life-threatening injuries; and
25	WHEREAS, the ASMP and the Congress Avenue Initiative both
26	recommend piloting a neighborhood shared streets program that uses traffic
27	calming and streetscape features that enable streets to be converted easily to public
28	use on weekends or during special events; and
29	WHEREAS, the Austin Police Department closes Sixth Street from Red
30	River to Brazos Streets on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings from 9:00
31	p.m. to 2:30 a.m.; and
32	WHEREAS, on May 23 rd the City Council approved the Palm District Plan
33	that initiated a broader approach to mobility in this area and could be informed by
34	this near-term approach; and
35	WHEREAS, exploring such a strategy for Rainey Street in coordination
36	with ATD's mobility study would result in data that could determine whether such
37	a closure improves or worsens safety and mobility in the area;
38	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF
39	THE CITY OF AUSTIN:
40	The City Manager is directed to immediately initiate a shared streets pilot on
41	Rainey Street in coordination with ATD's local mobility plan for the Rainey Street
42	neighborhood.
43	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:
44	The City Manager is directed to determine the appropriate dates, times, and
45	duration of this pilot in consultation with the Rainey Business Association, area

neighborhood associations, and the Emma S. Barrientos Mexican American 46 47 Cultural Center Board. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: 48 That the pilot should include consideration of options for electric vehicle 49 shuttles from off-site parking facilities on city property and/or city right-of-way as 50 well as designated queueing areas for taxis and transportation network companies. 51 52 53 54 **ADOPTED:**______, 2019 ATTEST:
