



Pedestrian Advisory Council Recommendation

Why is this relevant to the SCWAB?

- More flexible regulatory framework that allows Congress Avenue to evolve over time
- Near-term and long-term safety improvements where deaths and serious injuries have occurred
- One-way to Two-way street conversions
- Public Restrooms
- More space for pedestrians, no more than 4 vehicle lanes Chavez to 11th Street
- Any changes to lane configurations and/or bike lanes and sidewalks will alter accessibility to SCW



















SF's Market Street plan would ban private cars, add bike lanes

Better Market Street proposes new paving, a reinvigorated tree canopy and widened sidewalks that incorporate a sidewalk level bicycle facility; site furnishings, plantings and activated sidewalk space will serve as a buffer between the pedestrian throughway and the bicycle zone designed for users aged 8 to 80.


















IV. More restrooms

Pedestrian Advisory Council – Congress Avenue Recommendation

Key proposals

- Programmable car-free "flexi-spaces"
- "Festival street" design
- No more than 4 vehicular lanes (Cesar Chavez -> 11th St)
- Public restrooms

Other proposals

- Fund a PARK(ing) Day program
- Encourage more events on Congress through regulations and design
- City-organized Open Streets program
- Replace street-facing parking with small buildings (10th -> 11th Streets)
- Discourage vacant properties
- Comprehensive downtown parking strategy
- One-way to two-way street conversions
- Fund near-term improvements
