HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION JULY 22, 2019 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2019-0378 1804 E. 14TH STREET

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1947 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled frame bungalow with a partial-width front-gabled, partially inset porch; single 1:1 fenestration with 6:1 wood screens.

RESEARCH

All documentary evidence seems to show that this house was built on this site in 1947, but the style, scale, and configuration of this house suggests an earlier construction date. However, city records contain a construction permit rather than a relocation permit, so the documentary evidence must prevail.

The house was built by Elmo Marshall, a porter for Kuntz-Sternenberg Lumber Company, one of the largest in the city. Elmo Marshall died in 1951, and his widow, Hattie, a maid, continued to live in this house long afterwards. She died in 2009 at the age of 102.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house was not recommended for local designation in the East Austin Historic Resources Survey (2016).


Staff has evaluated this house for designation as a historic landmark and has determined that the house does not meet the criteria for landmark designation as set forth in City Code:

- a. **Architecture.** The house is a 1920s style frame bungalow, and may in fact be of that vintage, even though documentary evidence shows that the house was built on this site in 1947. The house reflects a common style with no architectural distinction.
- b. **Historical association**. The house was built by a porter for a lumber company who died 4 years after its construction; his widow worked as a maid for many years while living in this house; while this house could qualify for a depiction of the standard of living of an identifiable demographic group in Austin, it is perhaps not the best candidate to do so especially given some doubt as to its construction heritage.
- c. **Archaeology**. The house was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
- d. **Community value**. The house does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
- e. **Landscape feature**. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house does not meet the criteria for individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Elmo and Hattie Marshall (ca. 1947 - ca. 2009)

Elmo Marshall married Hettie Morgan in Travis County in December, 1927.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Elmo and Hattie L. Marshall living in a rented house in Justice Precinct 2 of Travis County. Elmo Marshall was 22, had been born in Texas, and was a laborer on a dairy farm. Hattie Marshall was 21, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a son, Clavern E., 1, who had been born in Texas.

Elmo Marshall was living at this address when he passed away in 1951. He was born in 1907 in Travis County, Texas, and was a porter at Kuntz-Sternenberg Lumber Company. His death was due to anesthesia after he suffered 3rd degree burns from kerosene to both of his legs.

MARSHALL, Hattie, 102, housewife, of Austin died Monday. Visitation 9 a.m. Friday, King-Tears. Services 11 a.m. Saturday, Ulit Avenue Baptist Church. Burial Evergreen Cemetery.


