Additional Backup Information:

The contract for organics processing is needed to accommodate the expansion of the organics collection program in Austin. The current curbside composting program handles material from approximately 90,000 customers and will add approximately 53,000 customers in 2019, with all remaining customers to be added in 2020. This contract will allow the diversion of food waste that is currently being sent to the landfill and help the City move closer to our Zero Waste and carbon-neutral goals.

The recommended contractor is the current provider of these services. The requested authorization amount was determined using departmental estimates based on historical spend and future usage.
