2019 Summer Camp, Cosecha Report

Camp Overview

The 2019 Summer Camp, Cosecha serves children ages 5-12 Monday - Friday from 7:30am - 6pm for eight weeks in the summer. The camp is separated into four, two-week long sessions. We serve a maximum of 32 - 36 students per session and assemble the students into groups no bigger than 12. We pair each group with an activity specialist and/or arts instructor to serve as their adult anchor as they transition between 3 different classes throughout the day. Our curriculum is focused on the overarching themes of Environmental and Social Justice through the Arts, and each section focuses on different themes. We explore and create in these themes by sharing Latinx history as well as introducing children to various arts techniques including (but not limited to): Animation; Digital Storytelling; Axolotl Club; Mixed Media; Dance; Puppetry; Capoeira; Illustration; Music; and Theatre for Young Audiences. Our education team prides themselves in providing quality programming; to do so we draw from Whole Child Development, Youth Program Quality Standards, Pedagogy of the Oppressed, and Culturally Relevant approaches to inform our curriculum, while imbuing the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS). These conscious choices in curriculum and program staffing were made in order to provide Austin youth with more than just arts camp; we provide our students with opportunities to use Latinx history and the arts to think critically about the world around them.
