The Emma S. Barrientos Mexican-American Cultural Center will host its annual Día de Los Muertos (Day of the Dead) celebration on Saturday, November 2^{nd} from 4:00 - 9:00pm. This event coincides with an exhibition of altars in collaboration with the Austin Veterans Arts Festival.

This lively event will include activities such as sugar skull decorating and face painting for all ages. Live music and dance performances highlight Mexican traditions. There will be on-site food trucks, a vendor market, and plenty of entertainment for guests of all ages. Come in your Day of the Dead costume to honor this celebration of life and death.

Altars or *ofrendas* in the Community Gallery will commemorating Veterans. The Veteran's altar exhibit opens to the public on October 18th and there is currently an open call for anyone to create an altar for the exhibition. Another collection of altars in the Zócalo plaza will be open to local community groups and families. There will be a collective community altar where guests attending the festival on Nov. 2nd can add their objects and pay respect to their loved ones who have passed on.


