HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION SEPTEMBER 23, 2019 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2019-0465 807 COLUMBUS STREET

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1941 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with a central, front-gabled projecting bay containing the principal entry to the house, which contains a broken pediment molding and surround consisting of fluted pilasters; single 8:8 fenestration with non-historic shutters.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1941 by Kenneth and Naomi McWilliams, who lived here for over 50 years. Kenneth McWilliams married Naomi Hodge in 1940 and moved into the house at 804 Columbus Street just prior to building this house. Kenneth McWilliams was an optician for Ward and Treadwell (later Treadwell and Treadwell), one of the city's principal opticians and optometrists, with offices downtown at 7th and Congress for many years. They later moved to a larger office and laboratory on 15th Street. He retired from Treadwell and Treadwell around 1980 and lived in this house in retirement until his death in 1998. Naomi McWilliams is over 100 years old now.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house was listed as a medium priority for preservation in the inventory prepared for the proposed Bouldin Creek Historic District in 2016; as such, the house would be considered contributing to a potential Bon Air Historic District. The house is not within the bounds of any other City survey to date.

Staff has evaluated this house for designation as a historic landmark and has determined that while the house has some notable architectural features, principally the broken pediment and pilasters at the front door, there is not sufficient other significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark under the criteria for landmark designation as set forth in City Code:


- a. **Architecture.** The house is a minimal traditional house with a distinctive Colonial Revival-styled broken pediment at the front entry; this architectural distinction in notable on this house as the other houses of this vintage in this neighborhood do not have the same level of ornate detailing. The house could meet the architectural criterion for landmark designation.
- b. **Historical association**. The house was built and owned for over 50 years by Kenneth and Naomi McWilliams. Kenneth McWilliams worked his entire career as an optician for one of the city's most prominent optical firms, but there do not appear to be sufficient significant historical associations to warrant landmark designation.
- c. **Archaeology**. The house was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
- d. **Community value**. The house does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.

e. **Landscape feature**. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house does not meet the criteria for individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Kenneth and Naomi McWilliams (ca. 1941 – ca.)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Kenneth McWilliams living in the home of his mother, Media McWilliams, in a rented property at 402 E. 2nd Street in Austin. Kenneth McWilliams was 30, divorced, and had been born in Texas. He was an optician. His mother, Media McWilliams, was a 63-year old Tennessee-born widow with no occupation listed.

Kenneth McWilliams appears in the 1930 U.S. Census as the brother of Roy C. McWilliams, who rented the house at 401 Willow Street in Austin. Kenneth McWilliams was 21, had been born in Texas, and was an optician. His brother, Roy C. McWilliams, 28, had been born in Texas and was a meter mechanic. Roy was married to a woman named Lola, also 28; they had a son, Roy, Jr., 2. Also in the household was Kenneth and Roy's mother, Almeda McWilliams, a 53-year old Tennessee-born widow with no occupation listed; the family also had a roomer, Inez Stillman, 20, who had been born in Texas and was a waitress in a cafeteria.

Kenneth McWilliams married Naomi Hodge in Travis County in May, 1940.

His October, 1940 World War II draft card shows that Kenneth McWilliams was born in Sprinkle, Texas in 1908 and was employed by Ward and Treadwell as an optician. He was 5'-10", weighed 163 pounds, and had a dark complexion, black hair, and blue eyes.
