Additional Backup Information:

The contract is for consulting services provided by Peter J. Park. The Land Development Code Revision Team anticipates three additional phases of the project beginning in October: public review and comment of the published draft code, Commission and Council deliberation, and (only if a new code passes) implementation. The contractor will advise staff in each of these stages to assist with evaluating the draft, communicating and explaining the draft, and advising on approaches and strategies for implementation.

In addition, the contractor will be available to meet with Council members, Committee and Commission members, stakeholder groups, and the public to explain the drafting process, code concepts, and how the draft addresses Council's policy direction. The contractor will also deliver presentations as requested.

Peter J. Park is an experienced City Planner who has served as Planning Director for the City of Milwaukee, WI and Denver, CO. He has also taught urban planning and design at the University of Colorado and the Harvard School of Design. He has specific knowledge on the City's land development code and its revision efforts from his work under the Opticos contract.
