Mr. Morgan holds a graduate degree in criminal justice and has worked in the criminal justice system for over a decade, serving on local, state, and national committees that address pretrial release, an issue integral to the safety of the community. Currently, he serves Travis County as the Chief Deputy County Clerk, where his duties include oversight of Court Services, Recording, Elections, Administration, Records Management, and Finance.

As Chair of the National Association of Pretrial Services Agencies Standards Mr. Morgan oversaw the 2015 revision of national standards for pretrial release, and as a member of the Travis County Employee Grievance Panel from 2006-2011, he addressed personnel grievances, and participated in hearings in compliance with applicable county policy, state and federal law.

Mr. Morgan has provided testimony and presented on multiple topics to various governmental bodies and legal organizations. He served as panelist and/or a presenter on topics ranging from probation, bail and bonding processes, diversion programs, pretrial release, to funding mechanisms for voting and election processes.

Mr. Morgan's academic and work experience will contribute to the commission's charge to regulate the promotion, suspension and termination of firefighters, police officers and emergency personnel in accordance with applicable statutes, rules and agreements.
