Subject Support residents experiencing homelessness

Recommendation to Council

The Mayor and Austin City Council should continue taking a comprehensive approach to addressing homelessness, centered on providing housing and support rather than punitive actions.

- 1. Prevent the forceful displacement, seizure of their possessions, and/or direct attacks on residents experiencing homelessness; and
- 2. Provide adequate support for proper relocation to ensure the safety and protect the dignity of residents experiencing homelessness.

Rationale

- Homelessness and housing instability disproportionately impacts the LGBTQIA+ community, specifically LGBTQIA+ homeless youth. Therefore, protecting the homeless community of Austin is a priority of the LGBTQIA+ Quality of Life Commission.
- The city currently lacks adequate shelter and housing for all of its residents, including the homeless community.
- Governor Abbott has directed the Texas Department of Transportation to forcibly remove homeless people and their belongings from underpasses in Austin.
- The homeless community continues to face dehumanizing rhetoric, property crimes, and direct attacks.
- Criminal citations further stigmatize and penalize the homeless community, creating economic barriers to ending the cycle of poverty.
- The city's primary goal should be to ensure the safety of all residents, including the homeless community.
