

TASK 1 – TRAINING & EDUCATION: Participate in a workshop as an opportunity to learn more about climate-related issues and contribute your thoughts to the conversation. Work with staff to design and develop an interview guide.

15-hour estimated time commitment

TASK 2 – INTERVIEW REPORTS: Conduct a minimum of five interview reports to gather and share information about climate issues within your community between December and March 2019 (dates TBD).

35-hour estimated time commitment

TASK 3 – ON-GOING PARTICIPATION: Collaborate with the Office of Sustainability to reach out to networks about the plan and support for implementation.

25-hour estimated time commitment
