The HIV Planning Council Comprehensive Planning Committee convened in a committee meeting on Tuesday, October 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at City Hall, 301 West 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Room 1027 in Austin, Texas.

### 1. CERTIFICATION OF QUORUM

a. Committee Chair Glenn Crawford established and certified quorum at 6:02p.m.

#### 3. INTRODUCTION/ANNOUNCEMENTS

a. Council member Emma Sinnott announced CommUnityCare has a second satellite site for prevention and HIV care.

## 4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES<sup>▶</sup>

- a. The minutes from the meeting of September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019 were approved with the following amendments:
  - i. Under council members in attendance, council member Bart Whittington was not present.
  - ii. Under staff in attendance, add Anjelica Barrientos, AmeriCorps Vista, as a staff member.

#### 5. NEEDS ASSESSMENT

- a. Year 3 Special Studies
  - i. Issue Area 1: Rideshare Pilot
    - Administrative Agents did not have representation at meeting to further discuss context on rideshare pilot.
  - ii. Issue Area 2: MAI Funds Should Address the Gap in Linguistic and Culturally Competent Services for the LatinX/Hispanic Population
    - Council member Alberto Barragan was not present to present on issue area 2
    - Currently still working on rewording questions on survey to make questions more open-ended.
  - iii. Issue Area 3: Peer Navigation
    - Committee Chair Glenn Crawford discussed a new cell phone application that was made and would allow those who have been diagnosed to reach out to each other for support.
  - iv. Issue Area 4: Centralized Ryan White Eligibility
    - The city does not want to pursue in purchasing print outs for cards.
    - A provider in the community is pursing adding a grant program number, which is an ARIES number, onto recipients' Map Card to widen the availability to pharmacies. The current pharmacy used by the provider isn't a retail pharmacy but by adding the program number to Map cards, it would allow utilization for that pharmacy and other pharmacies for those who use that provider.
      - It would instead have a Ryan White grant number with expiration dates.
      - Recipients would have to reapply every 6 months for the card.
  - v. Council member Bart Whittington suggested Roger Temme of Care Communities and Age of Texas to come to a Comprehensive Planning meeting to speak and present on deliverables. January or February was suggested for attended meeting.
  - vi. Discussion of drafting a letter of support for rideshare and centralized eligibility to be given to Administrative Agents.

### 6. LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR DELL MEDICAL STUDENTS

- b. Letter drafted be Council Member Emma Sinnott to request Australian owners to allow Dell medical students to utilize HIV Stigma survey tool.
  - i. Wanted to put emphasis on what the HIV Planning Council is, volunteer members who have been diagnosed as well as those who are allies.
  - ii. Added onto business agenda under comprehensive planning as voting item
    - The motion to recommend adding Letter of Support to business agenda was approved on Council Member Bart Whittington motion, Committee Chair Glenn Crawford seconded.
    - Council member Emma Sinnott added words to last line in letter:

"Subsequently we would use the tool to assess the outcomes associated with any programming implemented to reduce stigma in our community."

- a. 3 nominations have been made thus far for the professional star award.
- b. No nominations have been made yet for the community star award.
- c. Council Member Emma Sinnott suggested going to Harm Reduction Coalition to see if possible, volunteer nominations could be made.
