

Austin Transitional Grant Area (TGA) Administrative Agent (AA) Report to HIV Planning Council October 2019

PART A & MAI GRANTS ADMINISTRATION/ MANAGEMENT UPDATE

- 1. HIV Resources Administration Unit (HRAU) staff are still in the process of adjusting to and implementing the new PartnerGrants online contract management system. Subrecipients currently submit monthly payment requests through this database.
- 2. Phase I Monitoring Reports for Part A, Part C, HOPWA and City General Funds were distributed to all subrecipients this month. Phase II Monitoring Reports are under development and will be distributed to TGA subrecipients in the coming weeks.
- 3. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services announced on October 25th that approximately \$2.27 billion in Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program grants were awarded to cities, counties, states, and local community-based organizations in fiscal year (FY) 2019, for HIV services to more than half a million people with HIV in the U.S.

OTHER HIV RESOURCES ADMINISTRATION UNIT UPDATES

- 5. HRAU's Financial Analyst, Anthony Kitzmiller, has been selected to serve as Acting Manager for HRAU during Glenn Selfe's absence. Anthony has extensive knowledge of Ryan White and HOPWA program and funding requirements, experience working with a Planning Council, and understanding of OMB, HUD, and HHS regulations. Anthony previously worked in the San Antonio TGA.
- 6. Anthony Kitzmiller and Nancie Putnam attended the Texas Health Literacy Conference in San Antonio on October 3rd through 4th sponsored by the Health Collaborative, a nonprofit organization.
- 7. Trish Niswander will attend American Public Health Association's (APHA) Annual Meeting and Expo on November 2nd through 6th in Philadelphia, PA. Over 200 different sessions and posters will be offered on HIV treatment and prevention.
- 8. Austin Public Health (APH) is working to address findings from the June 2019 HUD HOPWA monitoring. The full response will require moderate changes to the program. Some of the proposed resolutions include recalculating client utility benefit levels, conducting housing quality inspections, drafting/updating program policies, and adding data reporting requirements to HOPWA Project Sponsors' contracts.

QUALITY MANAGEMENT & DATA MANAGEMENT UPDATE

- 9. The CQI Committee met on October 10th. Agenda topics included discussion on the 2019 Ryan White Services Report (RSR) timeline and changes, utilization of the Austin HIV website, Ending the HIV Epidemic: A Plan for America grant application, and Part A residential eligibility expansion to Blanco, Burnet, Fayette, Llano, and Lee Counties.
- 10. The contract has been executed and a venue selected for *Trans* forming Health, a transgender awareness training to be held on November 20th and 21st. Because of the large interest, two one-day sessions will be offered. The presenter, JoAnne Keatley, is a nationally recognized expert on transgender health issues. Participants will be subrecipient staff, Planning Council members, and HRAU staff.
- 11. QM staff participated in the Austin Fast Track Cities Seamless System of Care/Rapid Linkage workgroup on October 17th.
- 12. The 2019 Ryan White Services Report (RSR) timeline and manual have been issued, and preparation is underway for training providers on 2019 RSR requirements. The RSR opens on December 2nd, with a final submission deadline on March 30th. Changes in the RSR for 2019 include reporting income from 340B programs and pharmacy rebates. Providers must specify the HIV services that received the income.
- 13. The Data Manager will attend the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) 2019 HIV Surveillance Symposium on November 6th through 8th.
