### **Council Committee, Boards and Commission Action:**

June 3, 2019 -Public Safety Commission approved the draft WUI Code and recommended Council appropriate necessary funds to implement.

September 18, 2019 -Environmental Commission approved the WUI Code, Motion number 20190918 007b to support the WUI Code with conditions to be addressed in a rules development process.

October 23, 2019 -Building and Fire Code Board of Appeals technical board recommended Council adoption of WUI Code.

### **Additional Backup Information:**

The 2015 International Wildland-Urban Interface Code (WUI) is promulgated by the International Code Council and is intended to improve overall fire prevention and safety in the community. These requirements are intended to reduce the risk, spread and damage of wildland fires and to make the community safer by requiring that new construction and exterior remodels/additions built within identified Wildland Urban Interface areas meet specific compliance standards. The amendments proposed in the ordinance remove redundant requirements that can be found in other articles of Chapter 25-12 (Technical Codes). The Austin Fire Department recommends approval of this ordinance with an effective date of January 1, 2021. If approved, this is the first time the City will adopt and amend the WUI so the delayed effective date will allow design and construction professionals to prepare for the change in requirements.
