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3	WHEREAS, Austin Public Health received its first presumptive positive cases of
4	the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) on March 13, 2020; and
5	WHEREAS, subsequently the City of Austin and Travis County implemented
6	emergency measures, which included the closing of restaurants and bars as well as "non-
7	essential" businesses to ensure social distancing and a "Stay at Home" order designed to
8	slow the spread of the virus; and
9	WHEREAS, necessary efforts to mitigate the spread COVID-19 have resulted in
10	dire economic circumstances for many in our Austin community, including individuals
11	who have lost jobs as the result of the containment measures; and
12	WHEREAS, Resolution No. 20200326-091 directed the City Manager to:
13	• develop programs and consider options to support impacted businesses and workers
14	including those "in the creative, hospitality, service, retail, restaurant, music, child
15	care, construction, and film industries and other associated industries";
16	• explore possible funding sources, including the use of Hotel Occupancy Tax funds;
17	and
18	WHEREAS, multiple resources exist to support small businesses in this crisis, but
19	few opportunities are available individuals who have lost employment as the result of
20	emergency measures; and

WHEREAS, immediate financial support for individuals remains a critical priority, and another Resolution on the April 4, 2020, City Council agenda aims to address that general need; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the unique financial challenges that our music community faces in achieving economic stability, the Live Music Fund was created by Ordinance 20190919-149 and directed the allocation of an amount equal to 15 percent of the 2 percent authorized for expansion of the Convention Center to be used for local music that meets the requirements of Texas Tax Code Section 351.101(a)(4) and that is not funded through the Cultural Arts Fund; and

WHEREAS, these funds, known as the Live Music Fund, have been the topic of public outreach and deliberations by the Live Music Fund Working Group, comprised of Music Commissioners and representatives of Austin's Music community working together to gather and organize feedback on community priorities; and

WHEREAS, this Working Group continues to meet, but to date has not yet formalized recommendations on the use of this fund to assist musicians, and challenges with public engagement may further delay this process; and

WHEREAS, the City Council affirms the importance of the Live Music Fund
Working Group and its role in helping guide future investments of this money; NOW,
THEREFORE,

41	The City Manager is directed to consider the following possible measures to
42 j	provide support to musicians and individuals within music-related industries:
43	• Immediate use of the Live Music Fund for an Austin Music Disaster Relief Fund to
44	provide emergency grants available to local musicians, that conduct performances
45	that would be eligible for such grants under Texas Tax Code 351.101(a)(4) and who
46	have not received funding from the Cultural Arts Fund with eligibility to be
47	additionally guided by feedback from the music commission and nonprofit partners
48	and in a manner coordinated and not overlapping with financial assistance directed
49	by other Council initiatives.
50	• Provide a portal through City of Austin Music & Entertainment Division to feature
51	live music performances and provide way for viewing audience to tip artists and
52	purchase music.
53	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:
54	The City Manager is directed to consider the following possible measures to
55 j	provide support for creative artists:
56	• Immediate use of the Creative Spaces Arts Program (CSAP) for an Austin Artist
57	Disaster Relief Fund to provide emergency grants available to local arts with
58	eligibility to include assistance with rental costs.
