Additional Backup Information:

The City has the authority under state law to name public roads and assign address numbers within its city limits and has entered into an agreement with Travis County to coordinate updates to the 9-1-1 GIS database for the unincorporated parts of Travis County. This Interlocal Agreement between the City and the Capital Area Emergency Communications District (CAECD) authorizes the City, under Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, to maintain and update the CAECD's 9-1-1 GIS database during the period of April 1, 2020 through September 30, 2020 and to be compensated for such work. The City will be compensated for maintaining and updating the District's 9-1-1 GIS database during the period of April 1, 2020 through September 30, 2020 in an amount anticipated to be up to \$299,302.85. The initial contract took effect on October 1, 2018, and extended for a period of two years until March 31, 2020.
