**ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** The City receives an annual formula-based Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs. The CSBG provides administrative support to a network of local Community Action Agencies that provide services to low-income residents. The City is considered the "Community Action Agency" for Travis County. The grant program provides funding for the delivery of basic needs, case management, preventive health and employment support services to low-income residents through the City's six neighborhood centers and three field offices.

The goal of the grant is to assist persons affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. This is a two-year non-renewable grant that will start Spring 2020 and will conclude on September 30, 2022. The funds are stipulated to be used to assist Austin/Travis County low-income residents affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, the Austin Public Health Department's need for continuing funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
